  - Using obscene or bad language likely to cause offence to others • Hitting the side or back panels of the Bulla stand
- 2) No spectator ball games.
- 3) The consumption of alcoholic drinks is permitted INSIDE the social club bar, garden and boardroom areas.
- 4) Vehicles parked on the Grosvenor Vale site are at the owners' risk.
- 5) Wealdstone Football Club supports the FA's campaign on pyrotechnics (e.g. flares and smoke bombs). Any misuse of such items in and around the Ground will result in those responsible being asked to leave the ground and, in line with football authority guidance, may result in a report to the Police, potential prosecution and a ban from the Club of up to three years.

**WE have some tough challenges coming up, starting today with the visit of Forest Green Rovers who are a massive club for this level, top of the table and flying along under Robbie Savage who is doing a great job with a great group of players.**

was so impressive: Nathan Tshikuna's pass; Dylan Kadji's driving run and perfect slipped pass ending with Daniel Nkrumah's smart finish. Really pleased for Dan who had been out for quite a while with his dislocated shoulder - he's suffered lots of rehab work with the medical team and his goalscoring return was fully deserved.

Then, last Saturday, the long trip to Hartlepool saw a fighting performance that earned us a draw against a side who are five games unbeaten. We are four games unbeaten though, with three clean sheets and I was thoroughly proud of the boys to show the spirit and style we demand. That will be needed a lot during the winter months when the pitches deteriorate and the weather gets bad.

As for the FA Trophy draw: Cheshunt at home will be a really interesting tie as I know the club really well, just round the corner from the Spurs training centre and their manager, Mel Gwinnett, was my goalkeeper coach at Oxford City last season. We'll have the boys revved up for that game, as we do every game, and your support will again be vital.

**LAST Saturday saw an explosive start to our National League game at play-off hopefuls Hartlepool - with our former 21-goals-a-season striker Alex Reid scoring after just two minutes.**

The game had kicked off at 3.03 in support of the NL's lobbying for three up and three down... and when Nathan Tshikuna levelled with a genius strike three minutes later we thought it was all part of the campaign - if the game had kicked off three minutes early instead we might have missed all the goals!

There was a good reaction to the game's talking points on the Hartlepool fans forum the following day and well worth repeating here....

*"I thought we played well against a good Wealdstone side. Think we play better playing the high press which we did at times. Reid gradually getting back into his stride with a fantastic goal. Still think he was a bit too isolated though. Still think that the squad is too small to make the playoffs but no complaints about the effort and at times nice football. Wealdstone are a good team and we just about matched them."*

"Yes, I thought the game was enjoyable and maybe could have nicked it. Hope all the Mackem/Toon/Boro fans who attended on international weekend will come back again."

## For a moment we thought the 3:03 campaign meant you were expected to score a goal every three minutes!

*"Both teams tried to play decent football although, as ever, the away team were masters of the art of time-wasting. But at least yesterday it didn't look like two bad sides slugging it out, we look like a decent team missing that cutting edge, I also thought we looked fitter yesterday than in some previous matches."*

"Bunch of Part Timers, Wealdstone F.C. End Of."


*"So part timers should never really be competitive against full time clubs? Their keeper was MoM for them and made 4 or 5 excellent saves, we were better than them, creating more and better chances and we looked fitter ...the only thing missing was a winning goal. As for accepting what the team produces on any given day, that was overall a decent performance in my opinion."*

"Wealdstone were happy with a point. However, what is more concerning is that right at the end of the manager's interview he mentions that one of their players

was racially abused at the end of the game. Was anybody else aware of this or witness what happened? Not a good look for the club if this is true, given a couple of previous incidents that we've had bad press about previously. Said individual needs identifying and banning, should this be the case.

*"During the game i did see one of their players look up at the Millhouse Terrace with a "quizzical" look on his face - this is just what we don't need. Be a bit surprised given the diversity of our own squad wouldn't it? But it doesn't matter with some people. I heard Bingham and Rodney both getting it when they were wearing our shirt."*





# I admit to being part of the 'We're doomed' brigade so what I see now is a revelation

**A POINT at Hartlepool United is a decent one by any measure... and in fact any result at a BELT (bitter ex-League team) away from home for a small club like ours is welcomed.**

But if we aspire of being a play-off chasing side, then these are the games we should be winning - especially after playing so well as we did for the first two thirds of the game.

Despite going an early goal down - inevitably from the feet of former Stone Alex Reid, rifling in a fierce shot from an impossibly tight angle - Stones came back strongly before Tshikuna (right) landed a deft shot/chip into the far top corner a couple of minutes later.

Stones were the better side for the first period and for the start of the second, before the Pools got on top. Both sides probably thought they could have won, but a point aside seemed about right.

**What I have liked so much about this season is that when players have not been available, those that have come in have really performed.**

When substitutions have been made, the side has not been weakened. Man for man, each player is as good as each other: the value and strength of this squad is as good as we have had in years. Hartlepool

was a good example. We had a number of what you may say were starting players unavailable due to injuries, suspensions and international call ups, yet we went toe to toe with a BELT and brought home a decent point.


I will admit that I was part of the "we're doomed" brigade at the start of the season. We'd moved on another manager, one who was very popular with the fans but maybe less so with the squad; the budget was to see a significant reduction; and the appointment of Sam Cox was seen as a bit of a cost-cutting exercise with rumours that he was struggling to even appoint a management team.

Cox had taken over at the end of the previous season and had ensured that we had stayed up, but then been overlooked for the job full time and had had a chastening experience at Oxford City.

Several of our older, more experienced and better paid players like Eastmond, Dyer, Mariappa, Grant and Carayol moved on and we replaced them with players which fit the Wealdstone DNA far better - you could call them projects.

Players who for whatever reason have seen their careers not be where they want them to be, or

pitch are proof of the pudding that Cox is baking. Who knows where we can finish? Is a play-off spot too much for us to achieve? Who knows, but hopefully there will be no need for the Great Escapes of the last two seasons.

We have now reached 29 points for the season, a full three months before we did this last season, when it was late February before we passed the mark.

Cox is cooking, as they say.

Many of you will have listened to the StonesCast with our new investor, Nick Semaca. We had deliberately left the Cast until November to ensure that the lease would be signed, and the investment agreement delivered, but here we are in mid-November and the lease has still be signed - over 20 weeks after the announcement that heads of terms had been agreed.

The longer this goes on, the more uncertainty there is, but that should not take away from a fascinating podcast, even if I say so myself. Nick speaks incredibly eloquently and he's someone I could chat to for hours: he oozes confidence and charm, fizzes with ideas on how he will take the club forward with the existing board and, of course, deliver a new stadium.

Elsewhere, it's been good to see that the Supporters' Club have stepped up to offer very good rates for the coaches to Grimsby for the FA Cup tie in a fortnight. You could even argue that they have been overly generous, but with both coaches filled pretty quickly and still three weeks to go, surely there is room for another?

Loads of people have already booked trains (the 7:30 & 8:30am departures from King Cross are going to be very busy) and when you think that every extra fan that makes the trip to Grimsby means another fiver back in additional gate receipts (which are split between the teams), then the subsidy provided can be ameliorated.

I'm not expecting the Supporters Club to offer more, but maybe it's time for the club to do similar? Whatever, we should have a very decent following as the Stones dream of a place in the Third Round for only the second time in our history. **UTS!**

**What is your name and age?** Simon Hibbs, 51. Bloody hell am I really that old?! In my mind I'm about 21.

I was never really into football or sport as a kid but more into acting and performing... then in my late teens at college a close mate who was a United fan invited me to see them play Chelsea at Stamford Bridge. It was 22nd February 1997. He'd got some tickets for his birthday, through a friend of a friend, and they were a gift from David Beckham! We picked them up from the players entrance in a little brown envelope, and on the front there was my mate's name and at the bottom was David Beckham's signature. We were so chuffed that we'd got tickets

from David Beckham who was a rising star back then - and he scored United's goal in the 1-1 draw. That year United did the domestic double with the FA Cup and their Premier League title. Since then, though, I've realised the whole premier League isn't what it was for me - it's not as exciting as it used to be, playing out from the back, prices rocketing, rules changes, VAR, and too many players just falling over. I'll stick to the National League and the Stones thank you very much.

### What are your top three games of all time?

The game above, my first Premier League and tickets from David Beckham. Then the Champions League final 1999 against Bayern Munich - an unbelievable finish that won the club an unprecedented treble. And then last year's the FA Cup second round game v Wycombe Wanderers: it saw the record attendance at the Vale (3,534) plus I brought down a replica FA Cup (pictured right) for people to have a photo and make a donation to charity. We raised £500 on the day which was doubled to a grand total of £1,000 for the Michael Sobell Hospice who looked after my Mum.

**Tell us a bit about StuffonStuff ... your business which is a popular destination in the beer garden at the Vale, and in the Megastore?** So, I've been doing clothing and garments for Adam in the Megastore for about six years but then just recently added decorated pint glasses, notebooks and water bottles and a few other things. They are something I haven't seen before, and they seem popular with the fans and the players. Sam Cox, Nick Semaca, Big Phil Chinedu, Sak Hassan, Amar (Head of Security) and Lee Rumball all have theirs. And George Duck and Charlie Townsend. I also do them for companies and can put anything on them. So please ask on matchdays if I can help in anyway or have a look at [www.stuffonstuff.co.uk](http://www.stuffonstuff.co.uk). I used to work for a local children's charity, working with the youth offending team, and did knife awareness talks for the Home Office and all

the local schools, educating children of the consequences of carrying weapons. I also used to teach boxing training and it was when I went to get a few t-shirts made for my company G.L.O.V.E.S. that I ended up buying the T-shirt printing company that made them for me!

It is creative and it was a nice business to have going on the side whilst doing my acting and performing. That was back in 2010... so that's 15 years I've been doing the customising of clothing and gifts.

### What are typical prices for personalised beer mugs?

It varies from what you want on it but the prices for the glasses start at £10, and for a personalised shirt with your name and number and a badge on the other side they're £16. We also do notebooks, bags, shoe bags and water bottles.

**Can you tell us about Heads Up!?** Myself and Big E have been mates for a long time and have both had some issues struggling with what life can throw at you - with work, family, grief and purpose in life. And it can all build up. Blokes aren't good at talking, sometimes they can't talk to the people closest to them, they bottle things up and

then it builds and builds and in the worse cases end with them taking their own lives. We want to stop this happening, get blokes talking and break the taboo... and so we set up HEADS UP! the men's mental health group.

It started back in October 2025, providing a safe space where they can talk about what's going on, be heard, release the pressure and give them breathing space to work out what is it they need to do to move forward. We meet on Wednesdays at The Vale Social club 7pm to 8pm and everyone is welcome.

We know how hard it can be to leave the house and go somewhere you have never been, to discuss troubles you're having. But it will help you. Have a look at <https://www.headsupmhgroup.co.uk>

**What do you think of the facilities at the Vale? Do you think there are areas where the club can improve its interaction with the fans?** The new Wealdstone app is a great idea, but for me is somehow lacking. It could have so much more info, like the website it needs looking at. I think it would be good to have more info on the players, maybe click on a player and see a biography of the individual. The history of their football life, how it started, who they played for, where they want to go so we get to know them and connect to them.

Also, for me I'm dyslexic and I struggle pronouncing some of the names of new players so it might be good if there was a little video with them introducing themselves and pronouncing their names.

I've enjoyed the DAZN "Rolling with The Stones" and "The Stones Uncut" videos, which show the team talks and the training. You can appreciate all the hard

work that goes on behind the scenes and connects us to the club and the team on the pitch.

The event last month for the Yeovil game at the social club "Watch with Nick" was an amazing! What a fantastic idea and was a superb evening. Even without the first free beer, everyone cheered on the team and had a great evening... let's do more of those!

**Finally, where do you think Wealdstone FC will be in five years time?** I see great things happening at the club in the next five years but the first thing has to be the signing the lease for the current ground, then a lot of important pieces can fall into place. With top man Nick Semaca coming on board with his experience and passion, the changes he will bring will make us a closer group of fans as well as financially secure. The new stadium at the proposed site (the old Master Brewer) will be amazing, just around the corner from where I grew up!

Jay is touring all league stadiums to promote mental health with the support of the MIND charity.

The one thing *Heads Up*, *Head In The Game* and Jay Rosa have in common is we all want to help break down the stigma of men's mental health. We want men to understand that it's OK not to be OK... and the best way to help with this is to talk rather than bottle it up. Our meetings are informal and we listen

to members to hear how they want the evenings to go, so we all get the best out of the hour. We appreciate that it's a big step for men to admit that they may need help and an even bigger step to turn up to a group of strangers and talk about any issues. There is no pressure to talk when you come to our meetings, if you want to just sit and listen you are more than welcome. Sometimes just listening to other people it can trigger something in you that could initiate another step forward.

Could I take this opportunity to encourage you to talk to the fans around you. I see a lot of fans with their noses in their phones and their programmes prior to the game and at half time, so why not use this time to talk to a mate or a stranger and just ask "how are you?" Sometimes it just needs

someone to ask you how you are doing to make you feel like you exist and have someone to talk to.



from the previous season to eke out the goals - and the team started the season looking quite solid but perhaps a little pedestrian at times. The major summer construction of the Bulla Stand increased the atmosphere several-fold... and manna then fell from heaven in the form of a 37-year-old ex-Premiership winger called Glen Little (above). Having helped Wrexham reach the Conference play-off final the previous season,

Glenn had not been retained by the Welsh club and had effectively retired. Gordon was alerted to his availability and invited him down for training. His impact when brought on in the home game against Enfield Town had a huge effect on that match and, so it proved, the season.

Trailing 1-0 to the Es and looking bereft of ideas, Gordon brought Glen on after 32 minutes and the old soldier proceeded to pass the opposition off the park. The final score of 4-1 to the

Stones was in the end modest reward against a side totally demoralised by Little's skill, intelligence and passing ability. Midfield talent of that quality had not been seen at Wealdstone since the days of Robin Wainwright, John Margerrison and Danny Light, if ever.

His inclusion in the side turned a team of potential play-off contenders into prospective champions.

The team reached October undefeated in 13 matches. The lineup had settled into a defence of James Hammond, Wes Parker, Sean Cronin and Siva playing in front of Jonathan North. The midfield was Little, Bailey, Godfrey and Pett with McGleish and Chris Moore up front. Moore had started the season on fire and by the time of the shock 0-1 defeat by Margate he was the league's top scorer with nine goals. Inexplicably his goals simply dried up and he was soon to lose his place in the starting line up to Jonny Wright who had moved into the area having played the previous six seasons for Workington in the Conference North.

Following the Margate game skipper Wes Parker underwent surgery which left a worrying potential hole in central defence. Fortunately, Tom Hamblin arrived from Conference North side Gloucester City. The team were now simply purring along and enjoyed a run of 10 league games un-

defeated, nine of which were wins including another sensational Glenn Little-inspired 4-2 win at championship rivals Dulwich. In-form Hampton & Richmond Borough arrived at Grosvenor Vale and deservedly inflicted a 3-1 defeat on the by then league leaders.

The New Year hastened in the wettest January since records began and only two matches were played, a 3-2 reverse at Canvey Island and a comfortable 3-0 victory over Bury Town. Stones then embarked on an astonishing 15 league match unbeaten run, 11 of which were wins. Into midfield came Carshalton's captain, Luke Pigden and the vastly experienced Mark Bentley from Boreham Wood. Tricky forward Michael Malcolm arrived from Maidenhead while utility man Carl McCluskey made the short trip over from Hendon. With matches starting to come thick and fast and injuries taking their toll Gordon took on loan two youngsters, forward Charlie Penny from Millwall and midfielder Luke O'Nien from Watford.

This was now a squad of depth and quality and by early April, with other clubs succumbing to the pressure and dropping points, just two wins from the final 8 matches would secure the title. But is life, and more particularly football, ever that simple?

A Carl McCluskey brace and a

fine effort from Charlie Penny won the points at East Thurrock. But then nerves started to jangle just a little as the team mentally withdrew into a more containing style of play and suffered their first defeat in 18 games at Metropolitan Police. This reversal was followed in quick succession with a home 0-0 draw against Lowestoft and then a fortunate 1-1 draw on a truly dreadful pitch at Aveley against a hyped-up Grays Athletic.

Thus, the away match at Margate on April 15, 2014 became the evening of destiny. It needed either a Stones victory or Bognor failing to win at Hampton to see the championship coming to Wealdstone... and both possibilities were realised, Wealdstone winning 1-0 with young Charlie Penny securing his place in Wealdstone folklore with a well taken goal on 83 minutes whilst Bognor lost at Hampton 4-3.

Wealdstone's lead was now unassailable, which just left a final league game at home to Canvey Island, after which the players would receive the Championship Trophy and their winner's medals. In front of over 900 people an unlikely 0-0 stalemate looked to be on the cards ... until substitute Jonny Wright became the catalyst of change. With just 10 minutes remaining his clever pass saw young Penny hit the champions ahead.

Football can throw up scenes of drama and high emotion and popular clubman Peter Dean - who had briefly departed for St Albans on loan - entered the fray from the bench with barely a minute of normal time remaining... and he followed up a Jonny Wright shot that had hit the post and slammed it home for the last league goal of the season. He, the crowd and the Wealdstone players simply went berserk; Jonathan North ran the length of the field to share in the moment... a fitting climax to a magnificent season.







# ALL YOU NEED TO KNOW FOREST GREEN ROVERS GREEN ARMY



Founded back in 1889, Forest Green Rovers has a long and vibrant history, bringing the excitement of football to our local community and fans everywhere.

Off the pitch, we have spread our sustainable ethos to the sporting world, winning numerous awards in green business, leisure and catering, groundsmanship, sustainability – and let's not forget: The British Pie Awards!

## PLAYERS TO WATCH

### 1. LUKE McNICHOLAS Goalkeeper

The Irish 25-year-old signed his first professional deal when joining Sligo Rovers where he saw action in Europa Conference League Qualification games. He established himself as their number one before Wrexham signed him on a loan in August 2023 with an option to buy in January, which they triggered. 
goalless draw before returning to Wrexham due to injury in February.

The centre-back played 40 games for Charlton Athletic last term, who finished 10th in League One - and he would have played more had it not been for a few suspensions. At 6'6", Inniss is a giant centre-back who is a huge threat in both boxes. He is often the first to admit that he needs to add more goals to his game but netted a handful of times in the 2024-25 season. In 2022, Inniss was crowned PFA Community Player of the Year for League One, recognised for his outstanding work in the local community while at Charlton. Inniss has continued his community work during his stay in Nailsworth, something he grew a big passion for while at the Addicks.

**07. KYLE McALLISTER Defence**  
Wing-back, number 10, false nine - Kyle McAllister can do it all. He is the Swiss Army Knife in the Rovers squad, and Steve Cotterill loves his versatility. But it's not just versatility that Kyle gives you, it's quality as well. The Paisley-born winger has a wicked left foot, which he often uses to slice open an opposition defence. He is the Swiss Army Knife in the Rovers squad.

Kyle is a manager's dream. He trains hard and his work-rate during a game is exceptional. He has improved year on year at FGR and has become a key asset to the team. He has international experience for Scotland at U17 and U21 levels.

### 08. NICK HAUGHTON Midfield

Nick Haughton joins FGR from AFC Fylde having spent eight years with the north-west club. He enjoyed an excellent 24/25 campaign at the Coasters – scoring 19 league goals and made a number of assists missing just one match all season. His performances and numbers caught the eye across the division as he was named in the National League Team of the Season. The 30-year-old has spent seven years at Fylde – making 273 appearances in all competitions. Previously, the 30-year-old has had spells with Fleetwood Town, Salford City, and Chorley.

### 11. TOM KNOWLES Midfield

Knowles arrived from Walsall where he made 92 appearances for the club while recording 7 goals and 10 assists. The midfielder's best season came back in 2021/22 while at Yeovil Town where he found the net 10 times.

### 18. ISAAC MOORE Midfield

Joining on loan from Coventry City, Moore is a highly rated prospect who made four matchday squads for Frank Lampard's Sky Blues last season. An energetic and dominant midfielder who likes to win the ball back and get on the score sheet, he will be stepping up when making his first senior appearance this season.

### 20. YAHYA BAMBA Forward

Having played out an impressive 2024/25 campaign with Eastbourne Borough in the National League South, Bamba became Rovers' first signing of the summer ahead of the 2025/26 season. The 26-year-old is a lightning-quick forward who can play anywhere across the front-line.

### 21. TRE PEMBERTON Defence

A player who arrived in Nailsworth from Manager Robbie Savage's former club is versatile Pemberton. During his two seasons with Macclesfield, the 26-year-old was a consistent performer for the

Silkmen finding the back of the net seven times. His speed and athleticism are two stand-out qualities of his exciting all-round game.

### 29. KAIRO MITCHELL Forward

Started his career in Leicester's Academy before gaining a wealth of experience in the National League. Mitchell made the National League playoffs in 2021, 2022 and 2025 with Chesterfield, Notts County and Rochdale. A confident forward who has international caps for Grenada, where he has scored three times, he joins Rovers after impressing with back to back double digit goal tallies for Rochdale.

### 32. ABRAHAM KANU Defence

Abraham Kanu joins on loan from Reading FC for the 25-26 season. The 20-year-old defender signed his first professional contract with Reading in July 2024. During the 2024/25 season, he made 10 appearances in League One for the Royals as well as six cup matches. Additionally, Kanu played 34 matches in the U18 Premier League. Kanu has progressed through the ranks at Reading, starting his football career in their youth setup before advancing to the under-18 team and signing his professional contract in 2024.

### MANAGER ROBBIE SAVAGE

Robbie was appointed our first team manager in July 2025. As head coach of Macclesfield FC, Savage secured promotion to the National League North at the club's first attempt – winning the Northern Premier League collecting 109 points and scoring 109 goals. As a player, Savage enjoyed an illustrious career at the top level including 346 Premier League appearances at the likes of Leicester City, Birmingham City and Derby County. He also made 39 appearances for his national side Wales.




**IN THE last issue of your super soaraway Stones programme, in these very pages, I had a muse about our rivals over the years.**

Naming Braintree was a bit left field but hey, we were playing them that afternoon and the certain bitterness between the clubs, evident in the late 1990s, was worth mentioning.

That led to further questioning about who were currently worthy of that 'local rivals' tag now that our 1980s traditional dislike of Barnet and Harrow Borough - and indeed Enfield - had disappeared over very different horizons.

And then it struck me. What about St Albans City?

The Saints can be bracketed alongside clubs like Kingstonian who liked to lord it over our own dear Wealdstone when they were flying high and our fortunes were in the gutter.

Who recalls the Ks fans arriving at our then-shared home of the White Lion ground, Edgware, for an FA Trophy game in January 2000 when they were holders, and also flying high in the Conference? They thought they were

on the way to the moon under Geoff Chapple. They won the Trophy in successive seasons, 1999 and 2000, and several hundred turned up at the White Lion to gloat at our penniless misfortune.

"S\*\*t ground, not yours" they chanted as Paul McKay was sent off for handball, giving away a penalty in the opening stages as the Ks romped to a 5-0 win.

You don't forget that sort of thing. So did we then take any pleasure when Kingstonian's financial mismanagement led to AFC Wimbledon, their tenants at Kingsmeadow, taking over the stadium and send the Ks tumbling into oblivion? Of course we did.

And now, do we take any pleasure in the slow, crumbling demise of St Albans City, my local team, as they now appear to be heading for a similar abyss?

Kingstonian are now in Harrow Borough, Hendon and Rayners Lane territory, groundsharing at Raynes Park Vale in Surrey and playing in front of three men



# Alex Dyer and St Albans.. has he joined a club on the rise, or a club in demise?

and an insomniac dog in the Isthmian Central South division, three steps below their former glory days. St Albans are hovering perilously close to the drop zone in the Isthmian Premier Division and I must admit that fills me with sorrow. Eleven years ago, the Stones and the Saints met in a league fixture for the first time in 43 years, since we were humbled 3-0 and 5-0 by the imperious Hertfordshire team in our last season (1970-71) in amateur football - defeats that had harboured within me a grudge that was exacerbated when we finally met again at the Vale in the NL South in September 2014.

We were Isthmian League champions while St Albans had won promotion from the Southern League Prem through the play-offs. As a 13 year-old I had seen Saints win 3-0 at Lower Mead in that final amateur season and was scarred by their utter dominance. I waited all those 43 years for revenge.

But all I got was another 3-0 defeat (which nailed us to the foot of the table and put Saints in the top 10) and the delighted sneering of the St Albans Fans Forum. I've bored you with this story before, but I was goaded into posting a defiant message on their forum along the lines of 'we may be bottom of the

league but we'll still finish above the Saints'... and was laughed out of court. So I threw down the gauntlet of £20 if I was wrong, a wager eagerly seized upon by the fans of affluent City.

The upshot, of course, was that Gordon Bartlett got his act together; we recruited some solid players including Jefferson Louis, and remarkably, we finished 12th in the table with 54 pts from 40 games and a zero goal difference. Big Jeff scored twice as we won the return game at Clarence Park 3-1... a crucial three points as St Albans also finished on 54 pts with a zero goal difference. But we had scored three more goals!

So we finished one place about the Saints. And did I get my multiple £20 winnings? Mmmmm, I'll leave you to guess.

But those days are long gone and over the last dozen years I've come to enjoy my occasional visits to Clarence Park. The ground is a real Victorian throwback, in a good way, and has been the Saints home

since 1898. Now having covered both ends it is genuinely atmospheric.

The pubs nearby are great; they sell craft beer at several outlets in the ground and the Chicken George food shack is sensational! They are trendily sponsored by the successful local band Enter Shikari and happily attract crowds approaching 2,000 when they are winning.

But now they are not winning and things are getting ugly. Well, not Elephant Man ugly because this is genteel St Albans we are talking about... but perhaps a little fractious.

The club's owners, Lawrence Levy and John McGowan have been frustrated by an inability to strike a deal for a shiny new stadium between the town centre and the M25 largely due to local residents' complaints. Clarence Park, though lovely, has even less going for it than the Vale when it comes to corporate facilities, with a dilapidated clubhouse and a wooden main stand that might have been the bees knees in 1922, when it was built, but is now suffering from osteo-arthritis.

So I made the short journey last Tuesday night to see the struggling Saints take on Isthmian Prem

high-fliers Brentwood at the Park, partly intrigued by their current status - having been relegated from the NLS last season - and partly to say I'd seen Brentwood FC for the first time.

The Essex outfit, who all but disappeared when they merged with neighbours Chelmsford City in the early 1970s, reformed and have slowly been progressing up the pyramid. They have nowhere near the potential of St Albans but their 100-odd fans loved the visit to leafy Hertfordshire, mocking their middle-class hosts as they left delighted, Fagin-like, with the three points tucked into their back pockets.

And what of Alex Dyer and Adrian Marriappa, you are asking? Former Stones legend Alex, who opted to leave the Vale last summer, was the pick of the home side as he operated within 20 yards of the centre circle for the entire match, with literally everything going through him. As for Mariappa, who knows? He was in neither the team nor the squad list. But the Saints were desperately crying out for a classy, controlling presence at the back and even if he was found wanting in the NL last season surely he would be a first name on the team sheet two levels below?

Dyer spent 90+ minutes cajoling those around him as the Saints twice hit back from going a goal behind... but when Brentwood scrambled a third midway through the second half they seemed to accept another defeat. They buzzed around with Zane Banton, as ever, their most potent threat... but he was their main man ten years ago.

Things were looking okayish for St Albans just a month ago when, under Paul Culverhouse and his assistant John Bastock, they stacked up a few wins and were looking forward to a trip to Burton Albion in the FA Cup 1st Round. But then that duo suddenly resigned, lured back to their former club Kings Lynn. Saints crashed 6-0 at Burton; and then 4-2 at strugglers Dulwich before the setback to Brentwood. The healthy 1,800 crowds - despite relegation - had declined to just over 700 for the game I saw, and the lingering memory I took from that evening was the sudden exodus of the yellow-and-blue bobble-hat brigade with ten minutes still to play. And only just the one goal behind. They had lost faith.

Just 24 hours after the game, Gary McCann, the much-travelled ex-Hendon, Hampton and Billericay boss, was appointed by chairman Levy - and attracted much derision from the Saints fans after labelling his style of play as "vertical football" in his first interview. Not sure if that fits with the Alex Dyer philosophy!

But that news made me smile about the conversation I'd had with a couple of St Albans fans at the Brentwood game about the Culverhouse and Bastock defection. One was keen to maybe recruit Lee Bircham from Bedford Town. "But they are in the National League North" said his mate, "so why would he come to us? And anyway, he might bring his No.2 with him... David Noble!"



Wealdstone 2 (after extra time)  
**HOW on earth can this titanic FA Cup battle in the mud and mist of Southbury Road be 42 years ago? The middle game of an epic trilogy between these great rivals.**

To say that they were 'different times' is a gross understatement because the non-League football world was very different back then. Personally, I was in my pomp and felt right at the epicentre of the power battle between Enfield, Wealdstone, Barnet and Maidstone... the top three clubs in the South of England outside the Football League.

Enfield were Alliance Premier League (National League) champions and I was Sports Editor of the Enfield Gazette despite being Wealdstone through and through. This led to some resentment among the Es officials and their manager, Eddie McCluskey, who even tried to get me banned from their Southbury Road ground on matchdays before realising that the local press was all-powerful in those days. The lack of publicity would be akin to shooting themselves in the foot with both barrels.

My 'crime' was to merely point out that Enfield had fallen dramatically into mid-table by the time this eagerly-anticipated Cup tie came around and that the slump needed arresting. There were rumours of a highly-charged split in the changing room for personal relationship reasons.

My reporting was balanced but provocative and Enfield didn't like being unable to control the narrative. I even wrote a column in the Stones programme (invited by prog editor Steve Marshall) before the first of the trilogy of Cup ties explaining my views on promoting the game via the print medium, which can be

seen on the opposite page.

Enfield were rightly stirred and the upshot was a terrific three games, the North Londoners playing out of their skins to thwart a Stones side who were riding high at the top of the league table, unbeaten in 11 games until a surprise 1-0 defeat Dagenham on the eve of the first game. That finished 1-1 at Lower Mead, forcing Brian Hall's side into a tricky Tuesday night replay on a ground where Exeter and Port Vale had been beaten in the Cup in the previous few years, while Crystal Palace had only won 3-2.

It was daunting, but the team that Allen Batsford built - and he was now absent because of the heart bypass operation that led to his shameful removal from the job - had been tweaked with the addition of fast, tricky wingers Gary Donnellan and Brian Greenaway from Reading and Brentford respectively.

The marquee signing to replace classy midfielder John Margerrison, ex-Arsenal regular David Price, was a flop but we recovered from the loss of Stuart Pearce to Coventry in early November with the discovery of US student Steve McCargo who was out-

standing in Stu's No.3 shirt. The key component among Enfield's array of stars - and they already had Noel Ashford, Nicky Ironton, Keith Barrett, Paul Taylor and Steve King - was hard-nosed midfielder Lee Holmes who scored both the Es goals on a cold, dark night in North London.

The following season, of course, he signed for Wealdstone and that was arguably the capture that won us the non-League double that 1984-85 season.

But back to the Cup tie. The teams had fought out a 1-1 draw at Lower Mead in front of a disappointing 1,168 crowd... disappointing because the visit of Isthmian League Bishops Stortford in the 4th Qualifying round had attracted 1,657 customers. We had beaten Aveley and Basildon United to reach that stage.

But 1,268 clanked their way through the Enfield turnstiles for the (first) replay and were rewarded with a stonking game. The Harrow Observer match report (overpage) majors on the goalkeeping performance of Bob Iles, the former Weymouth and Chelsea keeper who had a tough act to follow in the revered Ray Goddard.

Iles was a bit hit and miss in my eyes but when he was good he was unbeatable... similar in many ways to Dante Baptiste although Iles' kicking - even in the 1980s when goalkeepers only had to be good with their hands - was often shocking!

## THE HARD SELL

WHAT do you, as a supporter, look for in your local newspaper?

Match reports? Certainly. Pictures? Certainly. Interviews? Certainly. Informed comment? Certainly. Talking points? Certainly.

But do you get them all? Rarely. When I was a keen, eager youngster who tuned to the sports pages of my local paper each week to find out how the 'Stones were doing, my appetite for Saturday's game was whittled by up-to-the-minute team news, gossip and the sort of comment that was always readable.

Not popular with the club or the devoted fan, perhaps, but impossible to put down. Many's the time I disagreed with what was written. Many's the time I sided with the club in their condemnation of that week's column. But, come what may, I never missed a copy.

It was compulsive reading - opinionated, pompous, contentious, and always informed. The easy way out, as a local newspaper sports editor, is to "follow the party line" and agree with anything and everything that goes on at the club.

It means keeping quiet when a big story breaks. It means not criticising the team or the manager - or the chairman - when things go wrong. It means, in short, not voicing an opinion.

But who's going to buy your newspaper when there's nothing in it to read? Fans don't want straight match reports - after all, if they are true fans they'll have been at the game to see for themselves.

They want something to talk about. Several weeks ago the Harrow Observer carried out a survey as to why more people don't come to Wealdstone... and, for the first time in months, supporters felt that their local paper really cared.

It was involved; it showed an interest. The fact that the apathy of the Harrow Observer itself has had a lot to do with the dropping-off in interest in the club is neither here nor there. It demonstrated that there is still a lot of people in Harrow who would be prepared to watch their local club if their appetite was whetted.

For, it cannot be denied, the media is magnificently manipulative. Splash a full-page FA Cup preview in the local paper and the club are guaranteed an extra few hundred on the gate, depending on the opposition.

Build up the game. Spice up the teams. Concentrate on certain players. David Price, who played in three successive FA Cup Finals for Arsenal in the late 'Seventies, now playing through all the qualifying rounds. Alan Cordice in opposition to his non-League striking partner, Noel Ashford.

Will Keith Barrett, another international defender, be able to cope with the extraordinary pace of Cordice? Will Wealdstone's magnificent centre-backs be unhinged by the guile of Steve King, midfielder?

These are the questions that should have had several thousand clamouring at the turnstiles this afternoon, eager to learn the answers.

We're the lucky ones. We're here. I just feel sorry for all those who might have been tempted, but weren't.

Brian Greenaway floated a free-kick over after 28 minutes and Cordice was on hand to head home.


Enfield were down, but proved they were not out as they hit back at Stones. A Dave Flint overhead kick from a John Tone cross
