## Stones' villain turns hero at Dorchester

**Dorchester 1 Wealdstone 1**  
SATURDAY'S villain Ian Fergusson became Tuesday night's hero with the goal that gave Stones a richly deserved draw at Dorchester's excellent new stadium, writes Steve Marshall.

It could however have been three points for Wealdstone had they not conceded yet another early goal. After only three minutes Morrell was allowed to run 40 yards and square the ball for Diaz to slot home past on loan keeper Steve Lewis.

An FA spokesman said on Tuesday that the competitions committee would be meeting shortly to discuss the affair. "The committee will be looking into the circumstances surrounding the match within the next few days," he said.
