Doig out to hold 'Five' crown

DEFENDING Champion Steve Doig heads the list of entries for the ninth annual Runnersworld Hatch End Five Mile Road Race on Sunday.

The 25 year old from the host club Old Gaytonians won the event in 1989 in the fast time of 24.05. He is not quite that sharp this year following some niggling injuries but the Scottish international remains one of the favourites for the 1990 title.

Gayts expect to field another Scottish international in Hamish McInnes who is gradually returning to good form after a poor summer season. Harrow Half Marathon runner up Mark Cursons should also be well up.

Hillingdon's Martin Phillips should be a strong contender and there will be a tough challenge from Woodford Green's John Sear who has been in good form so far this winter.

The veterans competition looks strong with local favourite Mike Green battling with Queens Park's John Willoughby and Henry Emerton from Colchester. Laurie O'Hara has won the over 50 title several times but faces a strong challenge from Birmingham's John Mills.

Former winner Hilary Baxter heads the womens entry along with Westbury's Sally Hale.

Entries will be taken on the day at Bannister Sports Centre in Uxbridge Road. Fees are £2.50 for AAA affiliated runners and £3 for others. The race starts at 3pm in Furham Field and all runners should register before 2.30pm.
