Super Wembley take Cup saga to a third game

A DEFIANT Wembley side ensured that their FA Cup 4th qualifying round saga with Nuneaton entered a third game following a goalless draw in Tuesday's replay at Manor Park, writes Richard Markiewicz.
 It was a tremendous performance by the Lions who battled valiantly throughout this tactical tug of war in front of 2,500 partisan home fans and against a Nuneaton team unbeaten in 16 previous matches.

With Tony Headlam and Adrian Smith pulling the reins in midfield, Wembley dominated the opening 45 minutes. Steve Lawrence hit the side netting with an angled drive early on.
 Borough keeper Richard Atwood needed two attempts to clear Andy Smith's downward header from a Henry Clark corner and later he used his legs to foil Adrian Smith after he had waltzed through the home defence.
 Lions only anxious moment during this period came when Cotterill ferried

the ball along the byline to set up Rosegreen whose close range shot was cleared off the line by Paul Shields.
 The visitors began the second half quite brightly as well but they frequently lost the ball in promising positions and this enabled the home side to take control. However, a resolute Wembley defence, superbly marshalled by skipper Shields, refused to buckle under intense pressure.
 Jeff Fanner made two fine saves and Andy Smith cleared another Rosegreen

effort off the line, but otherwise Nuneaton failed to wear down Wembley's resistance. And although they maintained the pressure in extra time, at one time having five successive corners, the Lions comfortably survived.
 The eventual winners face Woking away in the first round on November 14. Lions lost 4-2 there in the FA Trophy last season.

 Wasps rest several of their players involved in their recent league run, notably second row Richard Kinsey and skipper Dean Ryan. The back row also stand down, allowing Simon Holmes, a close season import from Rosslyn Park, to make his debut, alongside old Wasps favourite John Ellison. Chris Wright partners Andrew at scrum half.
 On Tuesday night at Sudbury, Wasps under-21 played a New Zealand under-21 XV coached by All Black legend Sid Going. Wasps lost 25-8 but they did have the consolation of scoring a late try through centre Lawrence Scrase.

Save Stones plea to fans

WEALDSTONE FC Supporters Club is urging all supporters of the club to make a huge push this week towards achieving the life-saving 2,000 membership of the Blue Ribbon Lottery Scheme.
