Stones score nine against nine after Southall sacking saga

SOUTHALL chairman Jim Loftus must take most of the credit for this nine-goal boost to Wealdstone's sagging confidence, not to mention their goal difference, on Tuesday night, writes John Cornfort.

With a bizarre sense of timing, Loftus sacked his manager, Dave Anderson, the former Harrow Borough assistant manager, just over an hour before the kick off.

Early arrivals amongst the crowd at the White Lion ground were then treated to the strange sight of Anderson's team signing a 'walk out' from the visitors dressing room in protest, and a selection of hastily signed replacements from reserve team football, together with new boss Gary Marks, walking in.

Unfortunately for Southall the contingency plan didn't quite work out for, even with keeper Kenny La-

vender staying on, they still only managed to muster nine players.

A thrashing was therefore always on the cards but the visitors battled gamely throughout and with Lavender, in particular, having an outstanding game, they at least had the satisfaction of denying Stones double figures.

The rout got underway in Wealdstone's first attack in the 3rd minute when Neil Yates played a one-two

with Paul Sheldrick and beat Lavender with a low drive. Five minutes later a defender's miskick set up Lee Tekell to make it 2-0.

A great 25 yarder from James Moore and a delicately chipped goal over Lavender from the same distance by Tekell put Stones four up within 13 minutes, but then they sat

ly ran out of ideas. Certainly their fascination for long range shots in favour of making greater use of

their two man advantage appeared to hold little merit.

The goals didn't start to flow again until early in the second half when Tony Smith, Troy Birch and Smith again added three in the opening nine minutes.

Tekell completed his hat-trick from a Smith cross and Leigh Smart got the ninth with a fine angled drive from 20 yards into the top corner, but although there were still 23

minutes left, a combination of Lavender and some appalling finishing ensured that Wealdstone were unable to improve on the nine they got in the season's opener at Cove.

Despite the scoreline, Wealdstone boss Gordon Bartlett was not impressed with his team's performance. He was not alone!

Stones eye-up Prince Edward

Site viewed as possibility for £2m sports complex

WEALDSTONE FC have confirmed their interest in the Prince Edward Playing Fields as a potential site for a multi-use sports and recreation centre, and a permanent home for the club.

It is expected that the 40 acre site, in Whitechurch Lane, Edgware, will soon be put on the market by owners, Camden Council, and Wealdstone, under the Harrow Sports 2000 umbrella, will be making enquiries about its feasibility for a community based sports facility and new base for the club, who are currently ground sharing with Edgware Town FC.

With the club's recently announced plans for a £2m sports complex at the Ridgeway, West Harrow, having run into opposition from local residents, the Prince Edward site could turn out to be a timely suitable alternative.

Wealdstone's general manager, Kip Hewitt, is due to meet Camden officials, along with other parties interested in the site, today.

He said: "Although we are already looking at a number of sites, the sudden availability of such a suitably located site is something we feel we must investigate."

"We are concerned at the possible loss of the pitches there which currently provide sporting facilities for so many local clubs, and our proposals would ensure that the vast majority of these would not be affected. This proposal would also safeguard this site for sports and recreation for the local community."

"We would be adding to and improving the existing facilities. Harrow Sports 2000/Wealdstone FC would propose to develop a multi-sports facility which would include a small community stadium for use by Wealdstone and a wide variety of other local sporting organisations.

"We feel our proposals will go a long way towards ensuring the open nature and long term survival of this important sporting area as well as improving the sports facilities available to the community in the Borough of Harrow."

Hundreds of sports enthusiasts currently use the Prince Edward site which has 13 football pitches, 13 tennis courts, a cricket square and an athletics area. The ground has changing facilities for 500 people.

Vase clash could boost Edgware

EDGWARE Town look to revive their flagging fortunes on Saturday when they visit Jewson League side Hadleigh United in the FA Vase.

With Hadleigh having a less than impressive record of only one league win this season, the Wares are unlikely to get a better chance to turn their own depressing run of results.

Edgware will be without Mark Ivers and John Shanahan, who are both cup tied having played in an earlier round for Wealdstone, but they add to their squad Fabio Valenti, who has been pulled out of the Middlesex under-18 team due to play an Inter-County game.

If a replay is required it will take place at the White Lion ground on Tuesday evening.

Harrow Borough visit struggling neighbours Hendon in the league match and will be without central defender, Bob Dowie, who will be unable to play against his former club because of business commitments.

Striker Neil Fraser is now fit after his lengthy absence through injury and he could make a place on the bench.

Defender Darren Seabrook and midfielder Mark Biggins have both been released by Borough.

Having conceded five at Oxford City last week, Wembley will be anxious not to suffer a

similar fate when they visit in form Bognor on Saturday.

They will be boosted by the return of Ian Bates, who has finished his six match suspension and will be available for selection.

Chertsey have released former Lions skipper Charlie Flaherty. Could a return to Vale Farm be in the pipeline?

Wealdstone will be without the suspended Rod Braithwaite for Saturday's visit to Camberley but Fergus Moore is back after his one match ban.

Leigh Barnard is unavailable, while Roy Marshall is doubtful with a calf injury sustained in the Senior Cup defeat at Feltham.

Kingsbury have no match on Saturday as scheduled opponents Horsham are involved in the FA Vase.

Horden, Keen, Oriot and Cott are all injured and will miss Rayners Lane's home game with Cheltenham Saracens.

Also out are Cockram and Metcalfe who are both suspended.
