Dallaglio to hear fate in next two weeks

WASPS' former England captain, Lawrence Dallaglio, should know his fate before the end of this month, according to RFU chief, Brian Balester.

Balester expects that the independent inquiry, which is probing allegations surrounding Dallaglio, will report within the next two weeks.

Dallaglio, who reported back for pre-season training with Wasps this week, has been cleared to train with the England squad on July 19 after resigning the captaincy and missing the tour of Australia.

THE young sports stars of Brent and Harrow were in action at Crystal Palace at the weekend in the Heathrow London Youth Games.


Brent, who finished 24th of the 33 competing boroughs, landed team gold in the boys' table tennis event.
