ished for their mistakes, as illustrated in the 13th minute when sloppy defending in clearing a harmless cross allowed Danny Nicholls to score Berko's opening goal. Wembley, however, equalised three minutes later with a brilliant goal from Leon Woodruffe who over-

came four attempted tackles on the left flank to burst into the box before finding the target with an angled drive. Woodruffe came close to scoring with a couple of other efforts soon after but on the stroke of half time Mark Harwood's clumsy challenge on the edge of the area

led to Wes Foley scoring from the ensuing free kick to put Berko back in front. The visitors continued to press after the break with Woodruffe denied a certain goal by a fine stop from the onrushing keeper after latching onto a poor back pass. Another equaliser appeared

on the cards, but more poor defending led to Berko increasing their lead in the final 10 minutes. The Wembley defence was found wanting by a swift break in the 80th minute and Oliver Lyons felled Nicholls to concede the penalty from which Terry Nightingale

# 'Payneful' cup exit for Boro'

## Old boy back to guide rivals to penalty shoot out victory

BOROUGH paid the price for defensive ineptitude and an inability to find the net from the penalty spot when they tumbled out of the Full Members Cup on Tuesday against First Division strugglers Chertsey Town.

But for former Earlsmead favourite Colin Payne, the Surrey club's manager, it proved to be a happy homecoming as his side held Borough to a 3-3 draw after extra time and then comfortably won the deciding penalty shoot out to secure their place in the next round. Things seemed to be following the script after Damien Markman, having failed to find the target when clear on two earlier occasions, gave Borough a 26th minute lead, taking a Jon-Barrie Bates pass in his stride and firing home off an upright. Three minutes after the break Chertsey were level when Ryan Ashe out-



paced Mark Cooper and beat Matt Pollard with a low shot that found the net via a post, but Borough were back in front five minutes later, Markman powerfully heading home a Dwain Clarke cross. However, with 57 minutes gone Chertsey equalised again with a chip shot from Richard McDonagh that caught Pollard napping and dropped into the far corner of the net, and with Borough unable to break the visitors' resolve, the tie went to extra time. lead five minutes into the first period when Alan Paris's slip allowed Rob French through to lob the advancing Pollard. Pat Gavin hit an upright from close range with the goal at his mercy, but there was only two minutes left when Borough finally got level. Danny Nwaokolo scoring at the far post from an Andy Rose cross. The penalty shoot out that followed started well enough for Borough with Nwaokolo and Bates netting, while Line and McDonagh replied for Chertsey. But after Paris blasted

his kick into oblivion and French scored, the visitors were in the driving seat - and even more so when Gavin carbon-copied the effort of his player-manager. Mitchell's miss gave Borough hope of a reprieve, but when the diving Banstead saved their final attempt from Rose, it was over and out for the Earlsmead outfit.
