Deadly Damien sinks Kingsbury

Harrow Borough 2 Kingsbury Town 1

BOROUGH super striker, Damien Markman, just can't stop scoring!

His two goals on Tuesday night brought his total to nine in his last four games and they were enough to see off the brave challenge of Borough's Third Division neighbours, Kingsbury Town, in this Middlesex Senior Cup clash.

Borough had major goal-keeping problems before the kick off. With David Hook still



not recovered from his broken arm and deputy Matt Pollard picking up a groin injury against Aylesbury, Borough boss Alan Paris belatedly got hold of Eric Talbot to play. But Talbot was delayed in traffic on his way to the ground and Harrow were forced to start

with only ten men and with midfielder Jon-Barrie Bates in goal.

Fortunately the visitors were unable to test his competence and after Talbot arrived in the 10th minute the home side's line-up returned to some normality.

By that time Borough could have been two goals up as Town keeper Sol Glasgow almost fumbled a Markman shot into his own net but from the resultant corner he made amends, tipping over a firm header from the same player.

However, Markman was not to be denied and in the 18th minute he opened the scoring. Ois Roberts set him up and he skillfully ghosted past several defenders and Glasgow before shooting home.

Four minutes later it was 2-0. Dwain Clarke broke down

the left and when he whipped over a perfect cross on the run, Markman was on hand to net with a superb diving header.

It appeared to be the prelude for a goal romp but to their credit Kingsbury bravely fought back with Ryan Fitzsimmons and Simon Huggett both going close and they really should have reduced the arrears on 31 minutes when Daniel Gustave headed down a Paul Moran cross into the path of Tony Perez but his close range shot was well saved by Talbot.

Kingsbury continued to grow in confidence after the break - particularly after Pat Gavin scorned two glorious chances of adding to Borough's lead, headed over an open goal after a great run and cross from Ishmael Dodds, and then firing wildly over from a Clarke cross.

Town looked set to make them pay when Dave Ryan was sent through a square home defence to beat Talbot and reduce the arrears on the hour.

But a free kick from Huggett, well saved by the diving Talbot, was the closest they got to taking the tie to extra time and it was Borough, who were denied a third goal when Moran cleared a Vladimir Gusvack header off the line, who moved into the second round where they will play host to Staines.
