Wares cash in after cup rivals lose keeper through injury



EDGWARE goals have become a rare commodity in recent weeks, so six in one game, indeed six in a half, was something of a unique achievement on Tuesday night in this Middlesex Charity Cup clash at Preston Park.

But this was no super, sharp shooting show from the Wares.

Against decidedly modest opponents, whose threat was almost non-existent, double figures would not have been inappropriate.

Sadly Edgware showed every sign of inability to get just the one goal required for a victory, let alone a haul, and it was only after Harefield had goalkeeper Elliott Bernstein carried off with an ankle injury early in the second half that the

visitors finally discovered the whereabouts of the net and set about burying their hosts.

Harefield forward Kevin Bucket took over between the sticks and within 10 minutes he was beaten by a good angled strike from Christian Glynn that opened Wares' account.

With 59 minutes gone a poor throw out by Bucket to Mortimer was intercepted by Glynn and he set up Leon Constantine to make it 2-0.

Substitute Jodie Yee fired in Edgware's third on 67 minutes after Constantine had cleverly flicked on a Dennis Attoh pass,

and two minutes later Yee netted again, cashing in on confusion between Bucket and defender Ed Aitken.

A powerful leader from Mark Leslie made it 5-0 two minutes from time and in injury time Constantine completed the rout, mesmerising several defenders, Bucket, Wares' supporters, and doubtless himself as well, before finding the net.

In the next round Edgware are away to either Hanwell Town or Kingsbury.
