Tate puts Stones through

Dunstable 3 Wealdstone 3
AFTER twice being behind, Stones secured a draw in a dramatic and incident packed second leg match to their Dr Martens Cup tie on Monday to go through by 4-3 on aggregate, writes Graham Smith.

Stones were on top in the first half hour with Richard Mellor and new boy John Hall twice having shots blocked by keeper Georgiou and Hall also hit the crossbar.

However, after 39 minutes Dunstable went ahead. The referee blew his whistle in mid-flight as the home side took a quick free kick and with the Stones defence stopping in the belief that the kick was to be retaken, Cody headed in off the crossbar and the goal was allowed to stand.

A floodlight failure, repaired by Stones' own Mick 'Spark' Garratt, extended the half time interval to 50 minutes and when play finally resumed, Dunstable took just six minutes to extend their lead through Lamb.

Hall reduced the arrears in the 68th minute with a fierce shot that went in off the keeper and Paul Holobam hit a post before his corner in the 74th minute saw Colin Tate head in the equaliser.

Smith restored Dunstable's lead but two minutes from time Colin Tate volleyed Stones level to take them into the second round on aggregate.

Bees for Borough if they beat Rugby

MONDAY'S FA Cup 1st round draw gave Harrow Borough the glittering prospect of a plum home tie against 2nd Division Brentford.

But it all hinged on them beating VS Rugby in last night's (Wednesday's) 4th qualifying round replay at Earsfield.

Borough managed a 2-2 draw against the Beazer Homes League Midland Division leaders on Saturday, despite having

to play more than half the game with only 10 men after having Andy Prutton sent off.

Prutton could pay a high price for his sins, if Borough get through to face the Bees on November 13, the fiery midfielder is almost certain to be under suspension and will miss the match.

Borough boss Harry Manoe is no stranger to the 1st round of the FA Cup, having guided Hayes there in six successive

seasons and claiming the scapls of league clubs Cardiff and Fulham in the process.

He said of the draw: "We couldn't have wished for a better incentive but at the moment I'm not even considering it. We're just concentrating on Rugby."

Whatever the outcome of last night's replay, Borough will still be meeting Brentford this season. They have been drawn at home to them in the Middlesex Charity Cup.

Away day blues for Wembley

DISAPPOINTING Wembley Ladies suffered their first away defeat in the Premier Division of the National League on Sunday when they went down 2-1 to Millwall Lionesses.

Millwall took a lucky lead in the 7th minute when a corner was headed back towards the net and Wembley defender Angela Pack missed her clearance, allowing the ball to trickle into the net.

But Wembley were level four minutes later. Wendy Grant found the overlapping Viv Leach on the right and she cut inside and beat a defender before crossing for Paula Cleeve to beat the keeper with a deflected shot.

Wembley's joy however, lasted only seven minutes before Millwall were back in front when a quick break ended with Tina Lindsay running through to score.

Wembley had plenty of chances in the second half but were unable to salvage a point. Paula Cleeve and Ayala Liran both got clear only to have their shots blocked.

Overall it was Wembley's worst display of the season as they failed to come to terms with a more physical Millwall side in a scrappy match.

Paul Bhatia's completes his suspension this week and misses Kingsbury's home league game against East Thurrock.

Edgware off mark with five-goal blast

TILBURY 1 Edgware Town 5
EDGWARE notched their first league win of the season with a vengeance on Tuesday night when they crushed Tilbury.

They got on top from the start and went ahead in the 9th minute when a Paul Dale cross was flicked by on Eugene Flynn for John Mangan to volley home.

Six minutes later it was 2-0 when Ronnie Nelson latched onto a ball out of defence and, despite being held back by the challenges of defenders on either side of him, he hit a screaming shot on the run past the keeper.

Edgware added a third goal on the half hour.

A corner was cleared to Seamus Finnerty and he laid the

ball off for Dale to fire into the top corner of the net.

Tilbury pulled a goal back in the opening minute of the second half, but Edgware kept their heads and restored the three goal advantage after 55 minutes thanks to the perseverance of Scott McGleish. He chased a back pass to Tilbury keeper Grey, blocked his attempt to clear on the edge of the area and then hooked the ball over him into the net.

A good move involving Said Louzi and McGleish saw Flynn rifle home Edgware's fifth goal and had they taken further chances in the remaining minutes, they could have won by a far greater margin.
