IN A busy week of player activity at Earlsmead, Harrow Borough boss Alan Mayes is poised to sign Andy Waddock, the brother of former Queens Park Rangers star Gary Waddock.

The 21 year old full back has just returned from a spell in Australia but Mayes' hopes of a boost to his ailing squad now rest on the club obtaining international clearance before they can land his signature.

Before he left for Down Under, Waddock was with Borough's Vauxhall Opel League rivals Hendon, having previously been with Queens Park Rangers.

As he waits for the Waddock signing to go through, there was good news for Mayes with Wycombe's agreement to extend the loan period of centre back Kevin Day.

He returns to action this week having missed the FA Trophy matches

against Windsor because the Loakes Park club did not want him to get cup tied.

And St Albans have agreed to extend the loan period of Lee Bozler who has impressed in recent matches - pleasing news for Mayes with his first choice keeper Stuart Mackenzie still recovering from his recent knee operation.

On the departures front, defender Darren Britnell has been released and has joined Chesham United, and midfielder Phil Dicker could also be on his way to the Buckinghamshire club.

Borough have accepted an offer from Chesham for the transfer listed player, involving a small fee, and they are now waiting on Dicker to decide whether

or not he wants to make the move.

Midfielder Steve Scott could well be returning for another spell with Third Division Swansea City after impressing their manager Terry Yorath when he joined the club for three days last week.

Scott trained with the club's first team squad and also played in a reserve team match against Hereford and Swansea have indicated that they would like to join them again.


