Stones to take on Yeovil in Alan's testimonial

WEALDSTONE will be hoping for a bumper crowd on Wednesday when their former manager Brian Hall brings his Vauxhall Conference club Yeovil Town to Lower Mead to play a testimonial match for Stones' popular striker Alan Cordice.

Cordice is Wealdstone's longest serving player, having been signed by then manager Allen Baisford in August 1980 from Norwich City. His first season with the club was not a

memorable one, as Stones ended up getting relegated from the Alliance League, now the Conference.

But the following season saw Cordice's prolific goalscoring talents help steer Stones to a clean sweep of the five honours on offer in the Southern League, including the Southern League Southern Division Championship, the overall League championship and the League Cup.

And back in the Conference, then

called the Gola League, Cordice played his part in the most historic season in Wealdstone's history when they became the first and so far the only club to do the 'non-league double' of Gola League Championship and FA Trophy in 1985. And for good measure Stones also won the Middlesex Senior Cup and the Capital League Championship that season.

On a personal note Cordice's talents have also been recognised at in-

ternational level and he has been capped nine times for the England semi-professional side.

He decided to call it a day in May 1986 but was lured out of retirement in December 1987 to continue to again become the scourge of non-league defences. In a superb career for the club, he has made 334 appearances and has scored 109 goals.

Yeovil are expected to field five ex-Wealdstone players in the match.

Bailey to the rescue

A DANNY Bailey goal saved Wealdstone's blushes on Tuesday night when they seemed to be heading for another embarrassing defeat against lowly Waterlooville, writes John Comfort.

With Paul Morris injured and Steve Browne and Paul Wilkins dropped, Stones fielding a much changed side to that which had slumped disastrously to Worcester on Saturday, but if there was any improvement on that sorry showing it was only negligible.

They did hit the woodwork when Tony Lynch's hard left wing cross canoned back off the near post but generally lived dangerously and in the 27th minute went behind when Kendall's cross had Kevin Foster and Alan Risk indecisive on the edge of the area and Moody slipped in to fire Waterlooville in front.

Samson Oralely had a fierce drive superbly saved just before half time and after the break Denis Byatt had a header cleared off the line before Stones eventually levelled in the 61st minute when John Margerrison's header was cleared on the line and Danny Bailey followed up to drive home.

Stones stepped up a gear in search of a winner, but without success and in the dying minutes only the alertness of Foster prevented the visitors snatching the points when Moody got clear through.

Windsor sign Boro' striker

HARROW Borough striker Richard Evans has been transferred to fellow Vauxhall Opel League club Windsor for this week for a substantial fee, believed to be £5,000.

Evans' future at Earlsmead has been in doubt for the past fortnight following the successful conversion of new signing Duncan Hardy from midfielder to striker.

And after talks with Borough boss Keith Chamberlin last week Evans was placed on the transfer list.

There were several early enquiries but said Chamberlin "Windsor's was the only deal I was prepared to accept."

But he declined to confirm or deny the size of the transfer.

No fee was involved when Evans was signed by Borough from Wokingham Town two years ago. In 87 appearances for the club he scored 28 goals.

Following Evans' departure, and with Borough still precariously placed in the Premier Division relegation zone, Chamberlin is now looking to add to his squad.

He is looking at one or two options and has already made an approach for Swansea City's left sided forward Andrew Legge.

Legge, whose contract with Swansea is up at the end of this season, has impressed Chamberlin in his recent visits to the Welsh club when accompanying on-loan Steve Scott. He also played against Borough in last week's friendly at Earlsmead.

Said Chamberlin: "He is not in the first team at the moment and could be released at the end of the season. I am looking to the possibility of having him for the rest of the season with a view to signing him permanently."

So far there has been no response from Swansea boss Ian Evans.

Chamberlin also has to make a decision this week on whether to sign striker Warren Gravette who has been on a month's loan from Maidenhead United.

Chamberlin waiting for verdict on Flynn

MANAGER Keith Chamberlin is hoping to have striker Paul Flynn fit after suffering an ankle injury in training for Harrow Borough's visit to Hampton on Saturday to play Kingstonian.

Mark Hopson and Steve Scott have both been suffering from flu bugs but are expected to be fit for selection.

Wealdstone go to Bath City with keeper Darren Williams still sidelined with a knee injury but they hope to have Paul Morris back after missing Tuesday's match against Waterlooville.

Kingbury Town face a tough task away to league leaders Staines but defender Paul Shields is likely to be fit again after injury to enable manager Alan Dafforn to select from a full squad.
