## Andrea leads the way

PARKSIDE Athletic Club's Andrea Whitcombe had a fantastic run in the World Cross Country Championships in Stavanger, Norway.

Running in the junior women's event, which was held for the first time this year, Andrea was always up with the leading group over the wet and muddy course and she was the first British runner home in 14th place.

Andrea was the youngest member of the British team and will still be eligible next year when the event will be staged in France.

Alison Wyeth ran for Britain in the senior women's event and had a fine run, finishing in 28th place. She was the third runner home for Britain who came 5th in the team event.

Parkside's Christine Kennedy, running for Ireland was the first Irish runner home in 33rd place - a great improvement on her running in the championships in Poland two years ago.

HARROW Boro' boss Keith Chamberlin is looking to sign Swansea striker Andy Legge this week.

# Town bid for treble chance

IN what is fast becoming the most successful season in the club's history, Kingsbury Town bid for the first leg of a possible treble of honours on Monday when they face Enfield in the final of the Middlesex Senior Cup at Uxbridge.

The Vauxhall Conference club pose staunch opposition but Kingsbury are no strangers to the role of underdogs and it is one they relish.

All bar Atkins seem certain to be fit and Atkins will probably be rested against Basingstoke anyway to ensure he is okay for the big Enfield match.

And there is a bonus in the return of Spud Murphy who sat out last Saturday's draw at Staines through suspension.

## Patsy on cue to rebuild his career

IRISH snooker ace Patsy Fagan is attempting to rebuild his shattered career with help from a car salesman and a taxi driver.

Patsy, who lives in Wembley, has teamed up with the snooker-mad managers Tony Brennan and Ron Tregar in a bid to return to the top.

He won the Coral UK tournament in 1978 and played for the Irish team on numerous occasions. But since then Patsy dropped out of the snooker's fast lane.

Now the 36-year-old, who is based at the Starlite snooker club in Sudbury, is working hard to improve his game under the guidance of his new managers, with his primary target being the forthcoming World Championships.

Tony Brennan said: "We found him working in pubs and on building sites and thought what a waste of talent. We decided to help him get his career back on the road to recovery and back to the top where he belongs."

## Blow for Stones as Williams breaks down

DARREN Williams' comeback after two weeks out through injury ended in disaster on Monday night.

The Wealdstone keeper lasted only 20 minutes of the Capital League game against Wycombe before his injured knee broke down and this latest setback will keep him out of the Easter matches at home to Ashford on Saturday and at Cambridge City on Monday.

Skipper Everaldo La Ronde is also an injury doubt but John Margerison will be playing, despite his sending off against Bath. His automatic two weeks suspension does not start until Saturday week.
