

Wealdstone's midfield ace quits

Morris blow for Stones

WEALDSTONE'S hopes of figuring in the honours this season were dealt a hammer blow this week with the revelation that club captain Paul Morris is quitting football.

Dynamic midfielder Morris played his last game for Stones on Saturday in the FA Cup tie at St Albans after breaking the news to manager Tony Jennings that for business reasons he could not continue playing.

Morris is a self employed carpenter and the growth of his business in recent months following successful tenders culminated in his decision.

Said a disappointed Stones boss Jennings: "With the amount of work he has, he cannot now encompass football in a working."

"He may have known the problem and tried to solve it, but in the harsh economic world his decision is understandable.

"It's a great blow, and we'll miss him greatly. He will be very difficult to replace."

Morris was in the middle of a two year contract with Wealdstone having signed for £5,000 from neighbours Harrow Borough 14 months ago.

Stones will retain his contract and his registration with the Beazer Homes League and he will be unable to play anywhere else.
