**Gurney goal spares Borough's cup blushes**

**Harrow Borough 2 Bishops Stortford 1**

BOROUGH avoided the acute embarrassment of a hat-trick of cup defeats on Tuesday night when Martin Gurney's second half goal saw them successfully negotiate this FA Trophy replay and line up a derby clash with neighbours Kingsbury in the next round on October 21, writes John Comfort.

But Borough had to work hard for their win against a Stortford side that made a fast and furious start to the match and thereafter posed a constant threat.

Certainly in the opening exchanges Borough hardly got a look in and it was somewhat against the run of play when they went ahead in the 13th minute from a free kick just outside the Stortford area. Jimmy Bolton drove the ball goalward and keeper Taylor fumbled it into the net in his efforts to save.

Borough grew in confidence after that but the initiative was cruelly snatched away from them in the 35th minute by the strangest of refereeing decisions. A through ball forced Tom McAllister to race from his goal to clear upfield from the onrushing Young but when the Stortford striker collided with the keeper, referee Harris amazingly awarded a free kick to the visitors which Gayle laid off for Forey to drill home.

The second half was an end to end battle but it was Borough who broke the deadlock with a superbly worked goal in the 63rd minute.

**It's over and out for Town**

**Kingsbury Town 0 Bromley 2**

KINGSBURY may have been hard done by in last week's replay, but there can be little doubt that Bromley were worthy winners on Monday when the two sides clashed for the third time in an attempt to settle their FA Cup differences, writes John Comfort.

It was a lack lustre performance from Town who failed to recapture the form that had seen them on top in the two previous encounters and with Bromley clearly in a more determined mood this time round it was they who claimed the ultimate prize - and with considerable ease.

Poor marking led to Bromley's opening goal six minutes into the second half when Grenfell's corner was headed across goal by the giant Edwards and the unchallenged Dorke headed home.

Another corner provided Bromley's clinching second goal in the 71st minute with Dorke again getting the final touch as keeper Fred Smart fumbled the cross.

Kingsbury rarely threatened. Their best chance came in the second half when Gary White worked his way into the box but then fired over.

**McAllister is the new Borough boss**

**CHAMBERLIN QUILTS**

KEITH Chamberlin has dramatically quit as manager of Harrow Borough FC - for the second time in less than a year.

Chamberlin made his shock announcement to the players after Tuesday night's FA Trophy win over Bishops Stortford. He is being replaced by goalkeeper Tom McAllister.

Chamberlin last vacated the job in October of last year to make way for the arrival of Alan Mayes. But after an unhappy four months spell, during which Borough plummeted deep into relegation trouble, Mayes was sacked and the reins were handed back to Chamberlin.

He steered Borough to Premier Division safety and was confirmed as manager at the end of the season, but now two months into the new campaign he has decided to stand down again because of increased business commitments.

Chamberlin has pondered long and hard over his future for the past month after being lined up for promotion at work.

"With my new responsibilities at work I will not have the time to run the side," said Chamberlin. "I didn't want to carry on doing it half cock so I informed the board three weeks ago that I felt someone else should be doing

the job." Ex-West Ham goalkeeper McAllister was the obvious choice as his replacement.

"When Tom joined the club he was given a coaching role and it was agreed that his involvement would be gradually increased with a view to him eventually becoming manager," said Chamberlin. "That process has now been accelerated."

A gradual handover will take place over the next two months with Chamberlin showing McAllister the ropes before he assumes total control when Chamberlin starts his new job in November.

"Tom has his own ideas for the side and I am sure he will do a good job," said Chamberlin. "We are all backing him."

Although no firm decision has yet been made, it is expected that Chamberlin's assistant manager, Steve Hawkins, will remain in the same post under McAllister.

As for Chamberlin himself, he intends to remain at the club as a director.

"I don't know in what capacity I shall be able to help, but in the long term I will have no involvement in the coaching or the team," he said.

**Risk signs on but misses Cup clash**

WEALDSTONE received a timely boost this week following the loss of Paul Morris, when defender Alan Risk signed a new two year contract with the club after some three months of haggling.

The problem of getting to matches and training from his Essex home has been the sticking point but a change of job has now effectively eased travelling difficulties.

Stones boss Tony Jennings said he was "delight" with the signing but unfortunately it has not come soon enough for Risk to be eligible for Saturday's FA Cup clash with Vauxhall League Division One club Wivenhoe at Lower Mead.

Jennings has injury problems with Mark Harrison (ankle) and Sean Norman (thigh) but he hopes that both will be fit to face a Wivenhoe side bristling with ex-pros, including John Lacy, Paul Price and Lili Fuchillo.

Jennings watched them in action against Croydon on Monday and was impressed. "They are a very experienced side and it will not be an easy game for us," he said. Jeff Fanner returns to the Wembley goal for Saturday's home match against Chalfont St Peter after completing his two weeks suspension. But Derek Brown, who missed the Trophy win against St Albans, is unlikely to have recovered from an ankle injury.

Following their FA Cup exit on Monday, Kingsbury revert to league action away to Chesham. Paul Shields is expected to be fit after missing the Bromley cup replay with flu but Henry Clarke will be absent through suspension.

Edgware boss Brian Rider has taken defender John Walsh on loan from Wembley to help him through his current availability crisis. Edware are away to Chesham on Saturday and Rider has both Ray Mangan and John Coleman away on holiday, John Mangan unfit with a hamstring injury and Mark White doubtful with flu.

Rider should have Lee Rider available after returning

from holiday and he has also added reserve striker Stuart Powell to his squad for the match.

Rayners Lane are in cup action again when they take on Bishops Cleeve on Saturday in the Federated Homes League Cup and on Wednesday they play Viking Sports in the Middlesex Charity Cup at Wealdstone. Lane boss Don Durkin adds Langston and Robson to his squad for these two games.

Harrow Borough have no game until Saturday week, which is just as well as both Andy Waddock and Martin Gurney were added to their lengthy injury list after Tuesday's Trophy win over Bishops Stortford.
