

A PAUL Bhatia goal 14 minutes from time saw Kingsbury into the next round of the AC Delco Cup on Tuesday night.

In an evenly contested game, the first half finished goalless, although Darren Morris was unlucky just before the break with a good effort that thudded back of a post.

Corey Browne also went close with a good shot from a Brendan Conroy free kick which was well saved by the Chalfont keeper.

However, Kingsbury took the lead a minute into the second half when from a Gary White free kick just outside the Chalfont area, Solomon Eriemo blasted home a low, hard shot.

Chalfont drew level in the 65th minute when Doug Taylor scored from a corner but in the 76th minute notched what proved to be their match winner.

Paul Shields beat the Chalfont keeper to a cross and headed the ball down and Bhatia lobbed superbly over defender Cummings on the line and into the net.

Ex-Wealdstone midfielder Corey Browne made a useful debut for Town which was only marred by getting booked for a foul.

Waugh boosts Lions back on winning trail

WEMBLEY recorded their first victory in six matches at misty Vale Farm on Tuesday with a workmanlike performance to progress into the third round of the AC Delco Cup, restoring lost confidence at the same time, writes Richard Markiewicz.

Tony Waugh recalled himself into the side and soon made his presence felt by scoring Wembley's first goal in the 11th minute.

Collecting a loose ball in the middle of the park, he spotted Ware keeper Ratcliff off his line

Wembley increased their lead in the 22nd minute, Derek Brown's first time cross was knocked down by Nick Katsiaounis for Mark Anderson to thump home.



Stones sign Gbogidi for £9,000

WEALDSTONE boss Alan Gane started spending some of the transfer cash the club received from the sale of Sean Norman to free spending Chesham United this week when he splashed out £9,000 to sign Paul Gbogidi from Vauxhall League Dulwich Hamlet.

Gbogidi is a tough tackling midfielder who Gane sees as the perfect partner for John Margerrison and his silken ball skills in the middle of the park.

He made his debut for Stones in Tuesday night's 4-0 Westgate Cup defeat against Dartford and afterwards Gane declared himself well satisfied with his new signing who had impressed with his no-nonsense biting challenges.

Gane's venture into the transfer market is unlikely to end with Gbogidi's arrival. Other new signings are expected at Lower Mead within the next few weeks, with the manager's priorities being a goal scoring striker and a central defender.

Gbogidi's signing brings Wealdstone's spending on players to an incredible £35,500 this - more than in all previous seasons combined.

Slick Darts give Stones a lesson in finishing

STONES were given a harsh lesson in finishing by Dartford in the first leg of this Westgate Cup tie on Tuesday night which left the Darts' progress into the third round a mere formality, writes John Comfort.

Wealdstone were always second best after Gayle outpaced a pedestrian Stones defence from the halfway line to fire Dartford into a seventh minute lead.

Steve Browne was unlucky not to equalise with a blistering 25 yard rocket in the 20th minute that brought an equally fine save from Harold and Paul Wilkins powered in a good header from a Goyette corner which the keeper again did well to cling onto.

But with 25 minutes gone Stones were shaken again when Dartford scored their second goal. A corner was needlessly conceded and

Taylor's kick, Garvey firmly headed home.

Harold did well to block Kelly's effort when Smart put him through and Dennis Byatt found the woodwork with a fierce drive but unlucky Stones were unable to make the breakthrough which would have put them back into the hunt.

The second half was evenly contested but slack marking allowed Dartford to score twice more and make next week's second leg purely academic.

Sowerby got the first after a Taylor cross found him unmarked 15 yards out, and Taylor himself completed Wealdstone's misery five minutes from time.
