Borough find goal form in derby clash

AFTER blank scorelines at Grays and Dagenham, Borough discovered their goal form on Tuesday, night to defeat neighbours Hayes and pick up three welcome points, writes John Comfort.

But they managed to miss their fifth penalty this season on the way, Paul Barrowcliff's weak kick being easily

saved by Paul Hyde after he had been brought down by Warren Kelly in the 38th minute of a first half dominated by Hayes.

However, despite their superiority, the nearest Hayes came to scoring was when Warren Kelly fired onto the bar and over and after the setback of the missed penalty it was eventually Borough who took the lead in the 41st min-

ute, Duncan Hardy heading home a Colin Payne cross with Hyde stranded in no man's land.

Borough were significantly sharper after the break and Eamon O'Connor missed a golden chance to add to their score when he headed wide after Tony Kelly had nodded a Billy Beggs' cross into his path.

However, Borough eventually

sealed their victory in the 79th minute. O'Connor cashed in on some sloppy defensive work to gain possession on the edge of the Hayes area and he slipped the ball through for substitute Paul Ripley to round Hyde and slot home.

Relegation a live threat to Stones

'We're not out of mire' says Gane

THERE was a grim warning from Wealdstone manager Alan Gane as his team plunged further down the Beazer Homes League table after Saturday's shocker against struggling Watrooville.

That 4-1 reverse saw Stones drop down into 14th place in the table and with only nine points now separating them from the relegation places, life is suddenly looking decidedly uncomfortable for the Lower Mead outfit, as Gane readily admits.

"We're not out of the mire," he said. "Losing our last three games has seen us drop from 8th place and although there's

a nine point gap the last thing we should do is consider ourselves safe from relegation. Other clubs have done that in the past and come unstuck.

"I won't be happy until it's mathematically impossible for us to go down. Until then we've just got to battle on."

Clearly mindful that Farnham went down last season with 51 points, while Stones currently have only 46, Gane sees the games over the Easter holiday at home to Chelmsford on Saturday and at Crawley on Monday, kick off 11.30am, as being of the utmost importance.

"They'll both be difficult games," he said "and it's important that we get results from them."

Chelmsford, who Stones beat 3-1 away on New Year's Day, have made a remarkable recovery in the past month, after appearing relegation certainties all season, and they will be looking to maintain their improvement and guarantee their own safety.

And Stones will find Crawley no less benevolent. They lay just below Stones in the table and will be equally anxious for points to steer clear of the strugglers.

With his forwards hardly prolific in goals, Gane is giving

serious consideration to the possibility of playing Steve Smart in attack against Chelmsford after his impressive performance there against Enfield in the Capital League on Tuesday. He is no stranger to attack, having been signed earlier in his career as a winger by Spurs who later converted him to defence.

Steve Browne is struggling to make Saturday's match with a rib injury, but Glenn Price, who was suffering from back trouble and Robbie Eccles, who missed Tuesday's game through illness, are both expected to be fit.

Kevin Collins and Kevin Foster are now back in training after injury, but David Flint and Samson Olaleye will both be seeking specialist advice this week over their respective injuries. Flint has an ankle injury while Olaleye has knee and back problems.

Wealdstone's Capital League match with Gillingham next week has been moved from Wednesday to Thursday.
