## Margerrison makes it a clean sweep of trophies

JOHN Margerrison scooped the awards at Wealdstone FC's presentation evening.

The popular midfielder already had the Jock Law Supporters Club Player of the Year trophy, which was presented to him before Saturday's final game against Moor Green, and in the evening he collected the Vice-Presidents Player of the Year trophy and also the Players Player of the Year Trophy, which he shared with defender Mark Harrison.

It is the first time in the club's history that one player has won all three awards.

Awards for 100 appearances for the club were made to Tony Lynch, Samson Olaye, Mark Harrison and John Margerrison.

Reflecting on the season, club chairman Alan Clifton said that it had been a season of consolidation. "When Alan Gane arrived at this club we were fourth from the bottom of the Beazer Homes League and we finished up in a creditable 12th place which pleased me immensely."

"As a club we strive to do the best we can. We've had our good times and our bad times, hopefully we'll do better next season."

Club vice-chairman Peter Braxton spoke of his 10 years at Lower Mead during which time the club has had 3 chairmen, 16 directors, 7 managers, 3 caretaker managers, 3 physios and 256 players.

# Chairman to go in big Borough board shake-up

## Three other directors will also stand down

DRAMATIC administrative changes are in prospect for Harrow Borough Football Club following the announcement this week that chairman Eric May and three of his directors are to resign in a big shake-up of board members.

The shock news comes at the end of what has been another traumatic season for the club in which they have again been battling to stave off the ominous threat of relegation.

Rumours have been rife over the weekend that Mr May was to quit and on Tuesday he confirmed this.

"I haven't resigned as yet," he said, "but I have indicated to the board that at the club's annual general meeting I will be stepping down as financial director and as a consequence shall be relinquishing the chairmanship."

Mr May's announcement opened the resignation flood-

gates. Company secretary Les Hunt said that he too would not be seeking re-election at the agm and both fund-raising director, Joe Mulcahy, and sports and social director, Malcolm Melbourne, indicated they would also be quitting.

Of the seven-man board, that leaves only vice-chairman, Peter Rogers, building director, Martin Murphy, and recently co-opted press and publicity director, Ben Romp, likely to be in office next season.

Mr May, who is in his second spell as Borough's chairman and a club member for almost 50 years, cited pressure of work as the reason for his decision to step down.

"This isn't just a club anymore, it's a business. It's very

time consuming and exacts a lot of pressure," he said. "There are times when any organisation needs a change and maybe we now need a change of direction."

Mr May has indicated his intentions in talks with the chairman of the club's vice-presidents, Henry Chinsky, and it is hoped that replacements can soon be found.

So far no-one has come forward but Mr May said that if no-one was immediately forthcoming he would not be leaving the club in the lurch.

"You can't say 'that's it' and walk out - there are far too many procedures involved," he said. "It's a transitional period and I hope someone will come along, but if necessary we'll soldier on."
