

Cadogan set for Cup call

WEMBLEY striker Lance Cadogan is set to return to the side for Monday's Middlesex Senior Cup final at Hayes — six weeks after breaking his jaw against Grays.

Cadogan, who has hit 18 league and cup goals this season, will play his first full game since having his jaw wired up, for the reserves at Slough on Saturday.

And if he comes through that with no problems he could resume his goal-plundering partnership with Peter Shodeinde.

Midfielder Adrian Smith will miss the match through suspension, which will give Derek

Brown the chance to play himself into the final side.

Wembley manager Alan Dafforn plans to give all his squad a run-out in three games this week, before deciding on his line up.

Apart from Cadogan, his other major decision will be whether to keep Tony Waugh at the centre of defence, or recall the fit again Paul Janaway.

"Ada's suspension is the biggest blow for us because he gives us good width," said Dafforn.

"We will be looking to go to Hayes to enjoy ourselves. Obviously we want to win and do well for ourselves and that is not

an impossibility. We have beaten so-called better opposition consistently all season and we will have nothing to be frightened of."

Hayes, managed by former Harrow Borough skipper Harry Manoe and nine times winners of the competition, expect to be at full strength. Their only doubt is striker Ray Knowles, with a knee injury.

Hayes, hovering on the fringe of the Vauxhall-Opel Premier relegation zone, booked their place in the final with a 3-0 victory over Hendon on Saturday.

The match kicks off at 3pm at Church Road.

New deal for Kerr

HARROW BOROUGH manager Keith Chamberlin has signed a new contract that will keep him at Earlsmead until May 1990.

The three-year deal is a sign of the confidence the Boro board have in 36-year-old Chamberlin, who took over from Mike Tomkys at the start of the 1985/86 season.

Before that, Chamberlin had a hugely successful seven year spell in charge of Boro reserves.

During that time, they won the Suburban League title four times and had one impressive run of 62 matches without defeat.

Goalkeeper Stuart MacKenzie, skipper Trevor How and midfielder Steve Emmanuel also signed new contracts on Saturday.

Emmanuel, one of Boro's most faithful servants, has committed himself to another three years, MacKenzie has signed for two and How for one.

Chamberlin is also hoping that another of his key players, top scorer Lawrence Holmes, will agree on a new deal this week.

On the transfer front, striker John Kerr has asked for more time to consider a move to Second Division promotion chasers Portsmouth.

Kerr, 21, has been offered terms by Pompey boss Alan Ball after impressing him in a recent reserve match against Crystal Palace.

But the United States International wants to talk the move over with his father again before he makes a decision.

Kerr, who played two World Cup qualifying games for his country, is in England studying law and originally planned to return to the States next month.

Chamberlin is set to recall Kerr, Richard Evans, Tony Guard and Robbie Johnson for tonight's (Thursday) home clash with Hendon.

Almond a tough nut to crack

The toast of Twickenham

WOMEN'S rugby made its debut on the hallowed turf of Twickenham on Saturday, with Wasps Ladies proving beyond doubt that they are the best side around.

Wasps steamrollered Richmond 19-0 to take the Women's Rugby Football Union Knockout in a match that acted as a curtain raiser to the Thorn-EMI County Championship Final.

Under the holy orders of referee the Rev Roger Parker of Staffs, Wasps won with two goals, a penalty and penalty try.

Centre Heather Sykes and number 8 Sally Treadwell, whose

father played rugby for England in 1966, scored the tries. But the star of the show was Karen Almond.

The 24-year-old fly half claimed a penalty and two conversions and generally gave Richmond a torrid afternoon.

"She is an excellent player," said Wasps Captain Sue Bennett. "Probably the best there is in Britain at the moment."

Almond was involved in a bizarre incident during the game, when her wayward conversion attempt struck a Richmond player and sailed over the posts.

Bennett, one of several ex-Loughborough University girls in

the side, said: "The match did a tremendous amount for women's rugby. It showed that women are capable of playing the game, and playing it well."

Meanwhile, in the main event of the day, the much criticised Rob Andrew outshone his Wasps team mates as Yorkshire lifted the County Championship with a 22-11 win over Middlesex.

Andrew, the only Wasps player in the Yorkshire side, was in sparkling form and had a hand in both his England colleague Rory Underwood's tries.

Middlesex fielded five Wasps players and two of them, Ken Moss and Colin Pinnegar, got their tries.

Wasps were well represented when the England squad for the inaugural World Cup was announced last week.

Mark Bailey, Kevin Simms, Paul Rendall, Jeff Probyn and Rob Andrew have all been named in the 26-strong party which leaves for Australia and New Zealand on May 12. Probyn has yet to win a full cap.

But there is no place for the versatile Huw Davies or centre Rob Lozowski, who played against Australia three years ago.

RECORD BREAKING RIEGAL

AT THE Middlesex Age Groups held at the Gurnell Pool, Ealing, Harrow and Wealdstone's Julie Riegall, 15, swam herself into the Middlesex County record books with a new Junior County record in the Group C/D 200m. Backstroke.

Her time of 2:25.13 was almost two seconds better than her own previous best time. She looked strong throughout the eight length swim and her excellent turns gave her even more of a lead over her rivals.

By the fourth length she looked well on the way to Gold and a new Junior County record.

Julie also won bronze in the 100m Butterfly group 'C' in a time of 1:09.71.

Rebecca Gloor posted 1:17.46 in the Girls 'D' age group 100m Breaststroke, to take gold, while young Vicky Sullivan was also triumphant in her event, the 100m Freestyle group 'A' in a time of 1:08.74.

Suzanne Brett was second to club mate Vicky in the group 'A' 100m Freestyle posting a very respectable 1:09.05. Kicking out hard on the last length of the race she couldn't quite catch her opponent and make the touch. Suzanne and Vicky both swam personal bests.

Maxwell Belcourt took home a bronze medal for his performance in

the Boys group 'A' 100m Breaststroke. His time of 1:29.76 was a personal best.

Duncan Belcourt, Damian LoCascio and Helen Williamson all came third in their events. Duncan caught home in 1:11.20 in the group 'B' 100m Backstroke, a personal best, while Damian made 56.17 for the 100m Freestyle group 'D' and Helen's time of 2:32.78 was for her performance in the group 'CD' 200 Backstroke.

Alison Derby came fourth in the final of the group 'CD' 200 Backstroke in a personal best 2:33.52 and Mashiohi Ohashi also took fourth spot in the 'B' group 100 Backstroke in 1:13.40, after having swum a heat time of 1:11.98.
