Adams injury blow for Boro' Trophy tie

A HAMSTRING injury sustained against Dagenham on Tuesday has put winger Mark Adams out of the Harrow Borough side which makes a quick return to Champion Hill on Saturday to face Dulwich Hamlet in the FA Trophy.

With Steve Scott still sidelined with groin trouble and Richard Evans not yet fully fit after his cartilage operation it means Matt Loddy will be pitched

into battle as Borough look to repeat Saturday's league win at Dulwich.

Said manager Keith Chamberlin: "Obviously it's going to be difficult but we've got to be confident after having won convincingly there on Saturday. I'll be very disappointed if we don't get a result."

If the match ends in a draw the replay will take place at Earlsmead on Tuesday night. Colin Tate starts a two

week suspension that day after being sent off at Leyton-Wingate, and would miss the tie.

Kingsbury Town boss Terry Dyson hopes to have a clean bill of health for their Trophy tie at Tooting.

"We have a few knocks including one to Neil Redding, but I hope every-one will be fit to play," he said.

Any replay will take place on Wednesday with Kingsbury's league match against Marlow being postponed.

Wembley travel to bottom club Wolverton in search of Vauxhall-Opel League points and goals. With Paul Bhatia now back in the side, Lions boss Alan Dafforn has no injury worries.

There could be goals galore at Wealdstone on Saturday as Stones entertain free-scoring Kidderminster in the GM Vauxhall Conference.

SPECULATION was growing yesterday (Wednesday) that Wealdstone manager Terry Burton and his assistant Tommy Coleman are about to quit the troubled club.

Both are understood to be increasingly frustrated with the team's current position. Wealdstone have not yet won a competitive game under Burton.

They have lost eight and drawn five of their thirteen matches.

Wealdstone chairman David Morrill is due back in England tomorrow (Friday) from Florida.

Yesterday vice chairman Alan Clifton refused to confirm or deny the rumours.

Chance to quiz board on club's new ground

MEMBERS and supporters of Wealdstone are being urged to attend next week's annual general meeting to find out what is happening with the club's new ground.

Supporters club secretary Nick DuGard says it is time all genuine Wealdstone supporters showed they are interested and want to have a say in the future of their club.

"I feel that all committed members of Wealdstone have a responsibility to attend the meeting not only to express their views but to demonstrate to the directors that they are concerned at what is happening," he said.

"The time is approaching when people will have to show they are bothered otherwise it may be too late to change things and have a say in what goes on."

"It is of fundamental importance to the future of the club that people start to get involved. This meeting is an opportunity for them to have a go and ask questions they want answers to. It is an ideal chance to debate the ground issue."

Two of the club's five directors are up for re-election to the board. They are vice chairman Alan Clifton and Michael Macario.

Clifton works at Wealdstone, running the club bars, and offered himself for re-election despite being elected last year. The club's system means two-thirds of the board must be elected every year, but as there are only five directors one had to volunteer once more.

Macario is an accountant who is rarely seen at Lower Mead for

football matches of any kind.

The meeting is next Wednesday, November 25, starting at 7.30pm in the Morrill Lounge at the club.

To get in, you must be either a member of the football club, or a shareholder.

There will be an opportunity to ask questions of the directors.

Manager Terry Burton has also been invited. Club chairman David Morrill is expected to jet back from Florida, where he is on business, to attend the meeting.
