
They will now face a formidable home tie with GM Vauxhall Conference side Welling United, writes *Aaron Gransby*.

Wembley seized the initiative from the start, going ahead with just five minutes on the clock, after a superb forward move, begun by Lance Cadogan in the centre circle. He turned to spray a perfect ball into the path of Dave Alexander and his accurate low cross was suitably finished off by Peter Shodeinde.

Staines fought back well and they levelled the scores after 17 minutes through Alan Myers.

Staines had a golden opportunity to go into half-time ahead when a poor back pass from Charlie Flaherty fell invitingly to Myers but he failed to connect cleanly.

Lions suffered a blow when Steve Lucas was taken off with a broken nose following a collision with Fanner, and Derek Brown began the second half in his place.

And it was Brown who played a large part in the amazing second half performance that Wembley conjured up.

With Staines on the rack, Peter Shodeinde blasted Wembley further ahead within three minutes after a spellbinding crossfield move.

Urged on by the large crowd, Wembley continued to go forward,

Dave Alexander cracking a low shot against the post after good work by Williams and Smith, before Cadogan wrapped things up seven minutes from time. Spud Murphy's cross was met by Cadogan who back-headed the ball past Peter Lara.

Alexander almost made it five just seconds from the end when he made a great run from deep to meet a 50 yard Derek Brown through ball and hit a rising shot just over the bar.

Swimmers facing an agonising wait

HARROW and Wealdstone swimmers must wait until the last heat is held to see if they have qualified for the final of the Hewlett-Packard Club Team championships on December 6.

They excelled themselves to finish second behind Portsmouth Northsea in the regional heats at Ealing on Sunday.

Several of their swimmers achieved personal bests as the team ended the day on 17,631 points, 699 behind Portsmouth.

Paul Shackley was first in the 200m breaststroke (2.21.19) and second in the 400m medley (4.42.14). There were firsts too for Alison Derby and Dave Robinson, in the 100m freestyle (1.01.21) and 100m butterfly (1.00.20) respectively.

Helen Williamson was second in the 100 and 200m backstroke (1.10.62 and 2.30.76) and Geoff Stewart took second in the 100m freestyle (52.99). He was also fourth in the 400m freestyle (4.12.87).

In the 200m breaststroke Rebecca Gloor was second (2.48.87) and in the 200m medley she was fifth (2.34.33).

Dalia Nissim earned a double third place in the 100m butterfly (1.08.19) and the 200m freestyle (2.13.73) while Julie Riegall set two personal bests in the 400m medley and the 200m butterfly (5.16.63 and 2.28.51).

Paul Maidment, Tim Rose and Andrew Pryce all swam into fourth places, Paul in the 100m backstroke (1.03.68), Tim in the 200m freestyle (2.04.55) and Andrew in the 100m breaststroke (1.10.05).

Mark Maidment and Duncan Scott were both fifth in their races, the 200m medley (2.17.34) and 200m butterfly (2.20.15) respectively.

Imogen Jolley was fifth in the 400m freestyle (4.46.71), Andrew Connell sixth in the 200m backstroke (4.25.95) and Siobhan Sullivan also sixth, in the 100m breaststroke (1.21.59).
