Adams transfer set to go through

HARROW Borough winger Mark Adams is due to complete his dream move to second division Brighton today.

Adams will have a routine medical at the Goldstone Ground and discuss personal terms before joining his new team mates for training.

Seagulls' boss Alan Mullery refused to talk about the transfer this week. He is angry that news of the four-figure deal was leaked to the press.

But Boro manager Keith Chamberlin said yesterday that Adams should become a Brighton player today once wages and the medical have been sorted out.

A delighted Adams admits that, at the age of 24, he thought a career in league football was beyond his reach.

"I am so pleased it has all gone through," he said. "At my age I really didn't think I would get a chance like this."

And he paid tribute to the part played by Boro in the transfer, saying: "The club have been very

good and Keith Chamberlin, especially, has gone out of his way to help."

Although Adams is one of his best players Chamberlin will be delighted with the deal.

For he signed him last January from Vauxhall-Opel league rivals Hendon for only £300. Besides paying an undisclosed fee, Brighton will also be bringing their full first team squad to Earlsmead for a friendly in the next eight weeks.

Adams, who was previously with Wealdstone before joining Hayes and then Hendon, lives in Stanmore and also works there, for a car leasing firm.

"I am pleased for him and hope now that he goes all the way," said Chamberlin. "He has been a super person to manage."

The blow of losing him will be cushioned by the presence of Matt Luddy, who has been waiting in the wings since signing for Boro from Southern League Dunstable last August.

Luddy, 21, was Dunstable's top scorer for two seasons prior to his arrival at Earlsmead.

Gulfer's parting shot for tip-top Town

The deadlock was finally broken when Gulfer's chip shot deceived the Oxford keeper and sailed into the net.

PARKSIDE'S 15-year-old athlete Andrea Whitcombe right has been awarded the Shaftesbury Trophy as the outstanding Middlesex County athlete for 1986.

The Trophy is awarded by the Middlesex County Amateur Athletics Association.

It comes at the climax of a year that has seen Andrea win two Middlesex cross-country titles, three Middlesex track titles, the Peugeot-Talbot Westminster Mile and a gold medal in the London Youth games.

Carianne McIntosh ran a marvellous first leg for Shaftesbury-Barnet Junior team in the Southern Counties Road Relay championships held at Rushmore Arena, Aldershot,



on Saturday, and handed over with a good lead of nine seconds in a field of over 70 starters. Her team eventually finished 9th out of 53 teams.

Carianne clocked up the third fastest time of 7min 50sec for the 2,000m course.
