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WELCOME TO . . . MOOR GREEN

Moor Green, founded in 1901 progressed to the Central Amateur League for season 1936/37 and won the championship 3 years running. At this time the club began a series of European tours and played against some of the most powerful continental sides, in fact in both 1933 and 1937 the club brought home the Verviers Trophy, a competition in which the Moors faced professional clubs from Germany, Belgium and France.

After the war Moor Green joined the Birmingham Combination, a strong professional league, and when that folded, moved on to the Birmingham (now Banks Brewery) League!

Moors remained an amateur organisation and struggled somewhat in the League, but achieved some notable cup successes. They won both the Birmingham Senior and Junior Cups and twice reached the quarter final of the Amateur Cup. These were boom years for amateur football, and the Moorlands record gate was set in 1951 in an amateur cup tie against Romford when 5,000 people witnessed the draw. The away record was achieved in the replay which attracted no less than 11,000, equalling a visit to the then awesome Bishop Auckland.

In 1966 the Moors moved into the Midland Combination in search of League success, but this had to wait until 80/81 when the double was won in style, the league title margin a massive 12 points.

The move into the Southern League came in season 83/84 and progress has been steady rather than spectacular. The final positions in the Midland Division reads as follows - 6th, 4th, 19th, 4th, 2nd, and last season in the Premier Division the club finished 15th after holding 10th spot for a short while.

BOB FAULKNER (Manager): Was assistant to Bobby Hope at Bromsgrove Rovers, moved to Moor Green as Reserve team manager 84/85 and created a team that won 3 major trophies. Was appointed first team boss Boxing Day 1985 with the team firmly in the relegation zone. Avoided the big drop by winning the very last game, and two years later, he guided the Moors into the Premier Division.

DEREK ALLEN (Goalkeeper): Signed summer '87, and held first team spot since. Came into prominence whilst at Bromsgrove. Former clubs include, Solihull Borough, Redditch Utd and Alvechurch.

COLIN ANGOY (Defender): Signed January 1990 following 5 years at Alvechurch. Hampshire born, he had spells at Southampton, Basingstoke and Notts County while at University.

GRAHAM CLEGG (Defender): Signed summer '86 from Sutton Coldfield Town following four years there. An outstanding player who had just made it into the Blackpool Third Division side when he left to go to college. Now a school teacher, he also had short spells at Willenhall Town and Burton Albion.

BOB COY (Defender): Close season signing from Aylesbury United, having been a regular for the previous season and a half. Previously at Northampton Town, Chester City for whom he played over 100 games, and the Wolves for whom he made 58 appearances, all in the first and second divisions. Was Chester 'player of the year' and Wolves 'young player of the year'.

DAVID BUSST (Defender): Signed Nov '87 from Kings Heath, and soon impressed with his positive and competitive style. His first club was Solihull Borough. Supporters 'player of the year'.

PETER ALLBUTT (Midfield): Signed March '90 from Bromsgrove Rovers for whom he made over 300 appearances in 7 years. Quick and skilful, he is a good organiser.

PHIL DAVIES (Forward): Signed March '86 from Henley Forest of Arden and became an immediate hit with the fans, who enjoyed his forceful wing play. Was top scorer 88/89 despite missing half the season through injury.

IAN TAYLOR (Midfield): Came through reserves to establish first team place during 87/88. Has the happy knack of being in the right place at the right time to score many vital goals. 'Clubman of the year'.

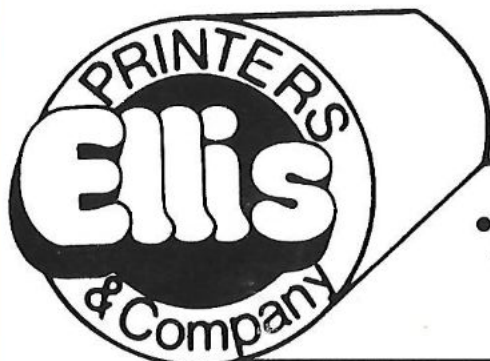
GUY RUSSELL (Forward): Signed September '89. Played in first and second divisions for Birmingham City and third division for Carlisle United. Recently returned from a spell in Finland. Was captain of Birmingham City Youth team that reached the semi-final of the F.A. Youth Cup.

DAVID FEARON (Midfield): Signed summer '86 from Bromsgrove Rovers, who spotted him at Earlswood Town. He is a player who can prompt others from midfield and also get forward to score some spectacular goals.

DAVID HADLEY (Forward): Signed summer '87 from Mile Oak Rovers. A powerful striker who is equally at home in the middle or wide. Has attracted the attention of a number of league clubs.

KEVIN MULLEN (Forward): Close season signing from Studley B.K.L. A much admired striker who has returned to the Moorlands after two years away. Other clubs include Redditch United.

SEAN KIMBERLEY (Midfield): Signed Oct '89 from Bilston Town. Was an apprentice and professional with Leicester City. Moved to Notts County and later had Conference experience at Kidderminster Harriers.

As another season draws to an end, it is usually a time for reflection and assessment of the previous nine months. Last season, at this time, I commented that the season had been a great disappointment. Really, one can say exactly the same again. It has been a roller coaster of emotion; a procession of events which took you up to the highest point only to send you hurtling down again at great speed. It can be said that there is never a dull moment, but a bit of stability wouldn't go amiss.

The season started with the news that we were going to leave Lower Mead once and for all. On the football front, Stones went to Alvechurch on the opening day of the season and came home with a 2-0 victory. It all looked rosy on the western front. From there on matters went down hill rapidly. Defeat followed defeat as the early season hopes disappeared. For me, the proof of how far we had fallen was demonstrated at St Albans City. The way our huge away following celebrated this victory in the FA Cup showed how desperate we had become. After all, this was only the first qualifying round. After the humiliation in the next round at home to Wivenhoe, a change in management was inevitable. Whether Tony Jennings jumped or was pushed is neither here nor there, despite being a genuinely nice man he failed as a manager.

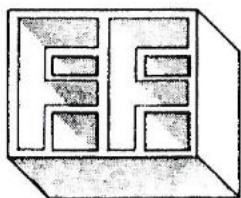
The next three months signalled as good a period in our fortune since the double itself. Results on the pitch surged upwards faster than a spaceship racing up into the heavens. The spirit on the terraces rose, performances on the pitch were those to be proud of. The victory over Dover was one of the great games seen at Lower Mead, the gritty performance at Dartford swelled the pride of another large travelling support. News came that Stones would be staying at Lower Mead, and the future seemed sweet. Then it all went wrong. Obviously, the majority site the Borough trophy match as the turning point but I think things went wrong after Bath City, the game before. Having played so well, fought so hard but to still come home pointless from Twerton Park must have been as heartbreaking for the players as it was for the supporters. If Bath was the beginning of the end, then Harrow Borough was THE end of the season, simple as that. We have still not fully recovered from that defeat.

However, one should, and must, be patient. We do not have the automatic right to be promoted. The Beazer Homes has the highest standard of all the feeder leagues, every year promotion gets that little bit more difficult. Alan Gane has proved himself as a manager at both Wycombe Wanderers and Staines Town, even if it is at the lower standard of the Vauxhall League. Perseverance has to be the motto to be taken on board. However, this doesn't mean that we have to endure gutless performances, but it does mean that we should wait. Promotion may not come next season, the season after that, or even in five years time, but we must improve every year until we are once again amongst the top dogs in non-league football.

Elsewhere, Dover Athletic finally secured the Premier Division championship after their 6-1 victory at Alvechurch. Alvechurch's second best crowd of the season, 589, saw Roberts give already relegated 'Church the lead after six minutes. Dover hit back though through Foley (12), Rogers (35) (57) (70) (84) and MacDonald (89) to win the coveted promotion place for the Conference. Bath City secured the runners-up spot when a Paul Randall goal after twenty eight minutes was enough to win at Crawley Town before 503 fans. With the ground safety problems that exist at Dover's Crabble Athletic ground, Bath may still win promotion to the Conference. They will have to wait until late May before confirmation of who will fill the promotion spot is known. Dartford also confirmed third place with a 2-0 win at Weymouth through goals from Hazeldean (44) (90) before 607 fans. At the other end of the table, the final relegation spot went to Ashford Town. They lost to already relegated Corby Town last Sunday and are relegated.

Looking back at my pre-season predictions, they don't make pretty reading. My top five: Dartford, Worcester City, Wealdstone, Chelmsford City, Bromsgrove Rovers. Well, apart from Dartford, three rest in the bottom half of the table and the other, a relegation candidate. As for my relegation candidates: Atherstone United, Waterlooville, Moor Green, Alvechurch. Well, I got one right, another that was involved for a long time, but Atherstone find themselves in the top five and Moor Green are in the top half. As for Dover, my prediction was 'they should finish in the top half, but will not challenge for the title!' Maybe, I should give up in future?

Anyway, congratulations to Wasps Rugby Club for winning the Courage League, it is nice to know one local club hasn't forgotten the way to win, especially beating a team from Enfield to win the title. Have an enjoyable summer, let's hope England have a successful, and more importantly, trouble free World Cup, whilst Middlesex rule the roost on the cricket field.

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SIDELINES by Neale Harvey

In pondering the question of who is going to win the World Cup it is almost impossible to see beyond Italy, the host nation. Not because they are playing well, they're not and have only scored one goal in five games, but because they will have the backing and expectation of one of the most fanatical followings in international soccer. If all goes well, I hope to be in Rome on June 26 to see their first round game against the U.S.A. and I fully expect to feel very lonely against the backdrop of noise and colour on display that evening. I'm not normally one for reminiscence but it is impossible not to cast my mind back to the European Championship in 1980 when Marco Tardelli scored Italy's winner against England in Turin. It was a great moment for all the wrong reasons, much like a bomb going off, and it triggered night long celebrations in the old city. Should Italy win their qualifying group they will remain in Rome for the second round where they are likely to meet Belgium, Colombia or Scotland. From then on it's a quarter final in Rome and a Semi-final in Naples, a more fanatical place than any other, then back to Rome for the Final. Whilst I am reasonably convinced of seeing the hosts in the Final predicting their opponents is a totally different kettle of fish. On paper, the strongest challengers appear to be West Germany, Brazil, Argentina, Holland and England. From that group I am going to dismiss England as winners. That's not to say the campaign is going to be a complete disaster, far from it, as I believe we could reach the Semi-finals. What worries me is that like the European Championship in 1988 England have remained unbeaten for so long now their record will become a millstone around their necks. I would much rather have seen us lose at home to Brazil the other week - it may have calmed a few people down, not least of all the press. I am also going to rule out Holland and Argentina, neither of whom are the sides they were and both of which have freely indulged in internal bickering about the abilities of managers or players. Of the other two, I personally like the look of Brazil. The traditional flair and skill is there and allied to a harder attitude they can without doubt win. To do so however, they may need to beat Italy in a Semi-final in Naples! For this reason, and this reason alone, I am predicting West Germany to reach the final as they appear to have the best of the draw if things go to form. It all really depends on whether the seeded nations win their qualifying groups. Of the outsiders Yugoslavia, Russia, Spain and Uruguay could provide the surprises and I wouldn't be shocked if one of those played West Germany in the Turin Semi-final. So much depends on the way each qualifying group finishes. As far as the Republic of Ireland and Scotland are concerned I feel both will qualify for the second phase where Ireland will be defeated. Scotland however could surprise a few people but will need either Argentina or Italy to fail to win their qualifying groups, otherwise they will oppose one of them in the second round. If they were to meet say Austria or Russia in the second round, who knows? So there we are, place your bets. For my part I'll probably read this again in ten weeks time and think how could I have possibly thought that? Costa Rica - World Cup winners after beating Egypt in the Final! Bring on the straight jacket!!

Another good reason for being in need of a straight jacket is reaching the end of another poor season at Lower Mead and still looking forward to next year's campaign. We say this time and time again but surely saturation point has been reached and things are going to look up on the playing side. Nobody can be in any doubt about what is required to win this league and the mere fact that champions Dover may have almost doubled our points total really says it all. If you finish a season fifteen points behind the champions you can normally look back at a poor run of six or seven games or the odd game that could have gone your way but didn't to justify things. Wealdstone however will finish about 48-50 points behind or put another way 12-13 wins instead of defeats. That is a hell of a big gap and it shows. The top three, Dartford, Bath and Dover have lost only 14 games between them, some three less than our total. There is a lot of work to be done, for in just three and a half months we have to go about the business of getting the good start so necessary to being in the leading group. We have to be in the leading two or three right from the start as has been proved this season, otherwise teams get left behind. Can we do it? Who knows? Maybe the manager and his team do, I certainly believe that is the case. People talk about challenges in football, well I reckon getting Wealdstone up into the Conference next season is as big a challenge as any. Apart from a winning team, what other things would I like to see. Well how about some new goalnets? There are so many holes in the old ones it must be costing us a bomb in string! And what about the kit? Having seen a bit of Bristol Rovers in Bath, I have to say the blue and white quarters look splendid and they are Wealdstone's traditional colours as older supporters will tell you. Let's adopt them again. Finally, instead of our usual friendlies at Windsor and Slough, why can't we have a three match tour of Scotland. Arbroath, Montrose and Brechin away in early August - wonderful eh!! Have a good summer and keep dreaming.



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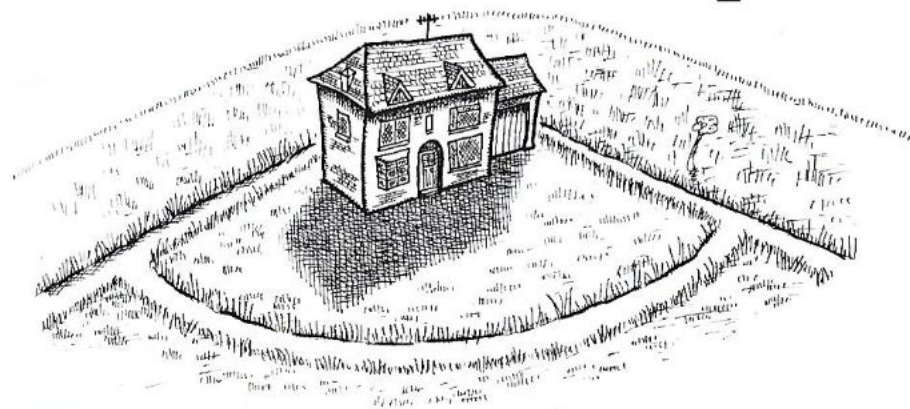


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
